



### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A SMS-83207 1/8 yd. Fabric B SMS-83203 1/8 yd. Fabric C SMS-73201 1/8 yd. Fabric D SMS-73206 1/4 yd. Fabric F SMS-73204 1/2 yd. Fabric G PE-426 5/8 yd.

BACKING FABRIC

Fabric G PE-426 (Included)

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included.

- One (1) 2" x WOF from fabric A.
- One (1) 2" x WOF from fabrics B.
- One (1) 2" x WOF from fabrics C.
- Three (3) 4½" x WOF from fabric F.
- Five (5) triangle templates from fabric D.
- Five (5) triangle templates from fabric G.
- Five (5) triangle templates from fabric E.
- One (1)  $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $17\frac{1}{2}$ " from fabric **G**.

### CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with 1/4"seam allowance.

- Take the WOF strips from fabrics A, B, C and the three strips from fabric F.
- Attach one (1) 2" x WOF strip from fabric A to one (1) 4½" x WOF strip from fabric F and one (1) 2" x WOF strip from strip C with one (1) 4½" x WOF strip from fabric F.
- Join one (1) 2" x WOF strip from fabric **B** with one (1) 4½" x WOF strip from fabric **F** and use the template to cut four (4) **BF** triangles.




DIAGRAM 1

- Now that you have your combined triangles ready, take fabrics D, E and G triangles and the assembled triangles and join them by rows following the diagram below.
- Then, join rows 1-4.



• Trim it to a 20½" x 17½" rectangle.




# CREATING THE BACK PILLOW

Sew all rights sides together with  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open.

- Take both 20½" x 12" rectangles from fabric G.
- Fold one bottom edge ½" towards the wrong side of the fabric of one of the rectangle.
- Fold the same edge ½" again and edge stitch the fold in place to have a clean edge.
- Repeat the same for the top edge of the bottom piece.
- Take the quilted pillow top and lay it flat right side up.
- Take one rectangle from fabric A and align it wrong side up to the right side of the pillow top.
- Take the other rectangle from fabric A and align it wrong side up to the left side of the pillow top.
- Pin the three pieces in place and sew around the edges at ½".
- Clip the corners and flip the piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Fill the pillow with a 20" x 12" pillow form and enjoy!
