Fabric A	PE-433	¾ yd.
Fabric B	PE-471	¹⁄₃ yd.
Fabric C	PE-470	¹⁄₄ yd.
Fabric D	KUS-23711	¾ yd.
Fabric E	KUS-23710	1⁄3 yd.
Fabric F	KUS-23709	¹⁄₄ yd.
Fabric G	KUS-23703	¾ yd.
Fabric H	KUS-23708	F8

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

- One (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A.
- One (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A.
- One (1) templalte 1 from fabric A.
- One (1) $31'' \times 4^{1/4}''$ rectangle from fabric B.
- One (1) 31" x 1½" rectangle from fabric B.
- One (1) templalte 2 from fabric B.
- One (1) 28" x 4" rectangle from fabric C.
- One (1) 28" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric C.
- One (1) templalte 3 from fabric C.
- One (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric **D**.
- One (1) templalte 1 from fabric D.
- Eight (8) 1¾" x 1¾" squares from fabric D.
- Four (4) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares from fabric D.



- One (1) 31" \times 6½" rectangle from fabric E.
- One (1) templalte 2 from fabric E.
- Four (4) 2" x 2" squares from fabric E.
- Eight (8) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares from fabric E.
- One (1) 28" x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric F.
- One (1) templalte 3 from fabric F.
- Four (4) 1¾" x 1¾" squares from fabric F.
- Eight (8) 2" x 2" squares from fabric F.
- One (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric G.
- One (1) 31" \times 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle from fabric **G**.
- One (1) 28" x 1" rectangle from fabric G.
- Five (5) WOF x 1½" strips from fabric G.

CONSTRUCTION


Sew all rights sides together with 1/4" seam allowance.

- Take one (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A, one (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric B, one (1) 31" x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle from fabric B, one (1) 31" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric C, one (1) 28" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric C, one (1) $34\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric G, one (1) 31" x $1\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle from fabric G, and one (1) 28" x 1" rectangle from fabric G.
- Join them following Diagram 1:



DIAGRAM 1

- Take four (4) 2¹/₄" x 2¹/₄" squares from fabric D, four
 (4) 2" x 2" squares from fabric E, and
- four (4) 1¾" x 1¾" squares from fabric F.
- Cut them in the diagonal to get eight (8) triangles from each one.



- Take fabric H and cut the eight (8) circles from each color:
- Orange, purple and green.
- Applique all the squares, triangles and circles to the bin blocks as follows:





DIAGRAM 3



- Layer each bin block and template with the batting and the corresponding rectangle and template fromfabrics D, E and F.
- Quilt all the pieces.



- Join them.
- Finish the raw edges of each bin, binding them with the five (5) WOF x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from fabric G.

BINDING


Sew rights sides together.


- Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the bin, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ½" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the bin top's raw edge.
- Stop stitching before you reach the last 2 inches. Cut the threads and remove the bin from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the bin edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pencil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the bin, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.


