



CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

- One (1) 134" square from fabric A.
- Five (5) 2"x 134" rectangles from fabric A.
- One (1) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle from from fabric A.


- Three (3) $2'' \times 4^{1/4}''$ rectangles from fabric A.
- Two (2) 2" x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric **A**.
- Ten (10) 134" squares from fabric B.
- Two (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles from fabric **B**.
- Two (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" rectangles from fabric C.
- One (1) 2" x 3¾" rectangle from fabric C.
- Three (3) 5½" x 2" rectangles from fabric C.
- Ten (10) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 1" rectangles from fabric **D**.
- Four (4) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangles from fabric **D**.
- Two (2) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x 1" rectangles from fabric **D**.
- Six (6) $4^{1/4}$ " x 1" rectangles from fabric **D**.
- Nine (9) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangles from fabric **D**.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ "seam allowance.

Block 1:

Join one 3½" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric B, one 3½" x 1" rectangle from fabric D, one 3½" x 2" rectangle from fabric C, one 3½" x 1" rectangle from fabric D, following the diagram below.



Join one 1¾" square from fabric A, one 1"
 x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D and one 1¾"
 square from fabric B.

 Now, take both assembled pieces and join them following the diagram below.



- Join one 1¾" x 5½" rectangle from fabric D
 on the right side of the assembled piece.
- Then, take one 2" x 5½" rectangle from fabric
 A and join it next to fabric D.



• Finish creating block 1 by joining one $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric **D**.



Block 2:

Join one 1¾" square from fabric B, one 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 1¾" x 2" rectangle from fabric A, one 2" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 1¾" square from fabric B, following the diagram below.

Repeat the same construction to create another strip taking two 1¾" squares from fabric B, two
 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D and one 2" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric A.





• Join one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangle from fabric **D**, one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" rectangle from fabric **C** and one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangle from fabric **D**.





• Now, join the assembled pieces following the diagram below.

Join one 1¾" x 5½" rectangle from fabric D
 on the right side of the block.



 Join one 2" x 5½" rectangle from fabric A next to fabric D rectangle creating block 2.



Block 3:

- Join one $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle fabric **A** with one 1" x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle from fabric **D**.
- Repeat the same steps to create a total of two block 3.



Block 4:

• Join one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangle from fabric **D**, one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" rectangle from fabric **C** and one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangle from fabric **D**.



Join one 1¾" square from fabric B, one 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 2" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric A, one 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 1¾" square from fabric B, following the diagram below.

• Join the assembled pieces from diagram 12

 To create block 4, join one 1" x 4¹/₄" rectangle from fabric D on the right side of the assembled piece.



Join one 3½" x 1" rectangle from fabric D, one 3½" x 2" rectangle from fabric C, one 3½"x 1" rectangle from fabric D and one 3½" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric B.

Block 7:

Join one 1" x 4¹/₄" rectangle from fabric D, one 2" x 4¹/₄" rectangle from fabric A and one 1" x 4¹/₄" rectangle from fabric D following the diagram below.

Block 8:

Join one 5½" x 1" rectangle from fabric D, one 5½" x 2" rectangle from fabric C and one 5½" x 1" rectangle from fabric D.

Join one 1¾" square from fabric B, one 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 2" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric A, one 1" x 1¾" rectangle from fabric D, one 1¾" square from fabric B, following the diagram below.

 Join one 1" x 4½" rectangle from fabric D on the right side of the assembled piece.




 Join blocks 1 and 2 following the diagram below.



 Join two blocks 3, block 4 and block 5 following the diagram below.



 Join blocks 6, block 7 and block 8 following the diagram below.



• Now, join rows 1, 2 and 3 to finish your block.


