## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.
Fabric A.

- One (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip.

Fabric B.
Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
Fabric C.

- Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2 " 1 " ~ s t r i p s . ~}$

Fabric D.

- Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric E .

- One (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip.
- Two (2) $161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Fabric F.

- Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric G .

- Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric H.

- One (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ strip.

Fabric I.

- One (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{11 / 2}$ " strip.
- Eight (8) $61122^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- One (1) 20 " $\times 5^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip.
- One (1) $25^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 / 2 / 2}$ strip.
- One (1) $161 / 2$ " square.

Fabric J.

- Two (2) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1$ 1⁄2" strips.

Fabric K.

- One (1) 4" x WOF.


## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

For this project we will work with four different strip sets.

## Strip Set 1 (SS1)

- Sew one (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric F, D, J, and E .
- The first strip is sewn $1^{1 / 2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ in from the left edge of the second strip, the second strip is sewn $1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ in from the left ede of the third strip, and the forth strip is sewn $1^{1 / 2 "}$ in from the left edge of the third strip.
- Using the 45 degree guide from your quilting ruler cut eight ( 8 ) $1^{11 / 2 "}$ wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 1.



## Strip Set 2 (SS2).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1, sew one (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric C, G, I, and J.
- Cut eight (8) $1^{1} / 2 "$ wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 2.

## Strip Set 3 (SS3).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1 , sew one (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric $\mathrm{B}, \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{G}$, and $D$.
- Cut eight (8) $1^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 3.

## Strip Set 4 (SS4).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1 sew one (1) $21^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric A, B, C, and $F$.
- Cut eight (8) $1^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 4.

- Take a $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square from fabric I and cut it diagonally. You will end up with two triangles per square.
- Repeat the same step with the remaining 612 " squares. you should have sixteen (16) triangles in total

## Block 1:

- Sew SS1, SS2, SS3 and SS4.
- Repeat this step 7 more times.
- You should have a total of eight blocks 1.

## Block 2:

- Sew two triangles from fabric I to block 1.
- Note the orientation of block 1 before sewing the triangles.
- Repeat this step 7 more times, you should have a total of eight block 2.
- See diagram below for reference.

## Block 3:

- Sew two blocks 2 together. Repeat this step three more times.
- You should have a total of four blocks 3.

- Arrange blocks 3 into two rows of two blocks each.
- Sew blocks in row 1, sew rows in row 2, then sew rows together.


## Row 1

Row 2


- Trim excess fabric, see diagram below.

- Take one (1) square from fabrill and sew it with lone star block by the sides and bottom. Repeat the same step with two (2) 16½" square from fabric $E$ (That will be the lining)
- See diagram below.
- Insert the main bag inside the lining body, so the right sides are together.
- Match all the seamlines and pin.
- See diagram below for reference.

DIAGRAM 15

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- Stitch handles $1 / 2$ " facing the right side of the bag.
- Secure the straps by stitching a rectangle on each strap.
