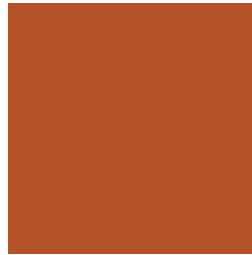

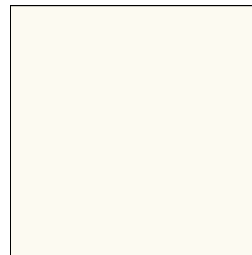

BACK OF THE PILLOW
Fabric **K** PE-408 (Included)

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

*1/4" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.*

- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **A**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **B**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **C**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **D**.



- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **E**.
- One (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric **E**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **F**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **G**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **H**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **I**.
- One (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **J**.
- Ten (10) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " squares from fabric **K**.
- One (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric **K**.
- Two (2) $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric **K**.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

- Take one (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabrics **A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I** and **J**, and ten (10) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " squares from fabric **K**.
- Pair every $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabrics **A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I** and **J** with one $5\frac{3}{4}$ " square from fabric **K** and do the 8 at a time HST:

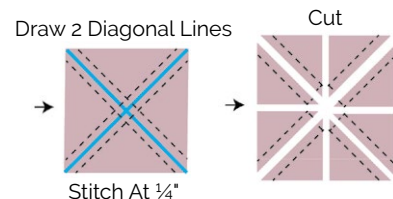
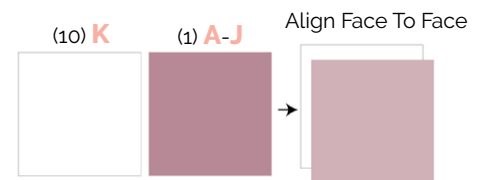


DIAGRAM 1

- Take one (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabrics **E** and **K** and follow the diagram to get two HST, you will only need one .

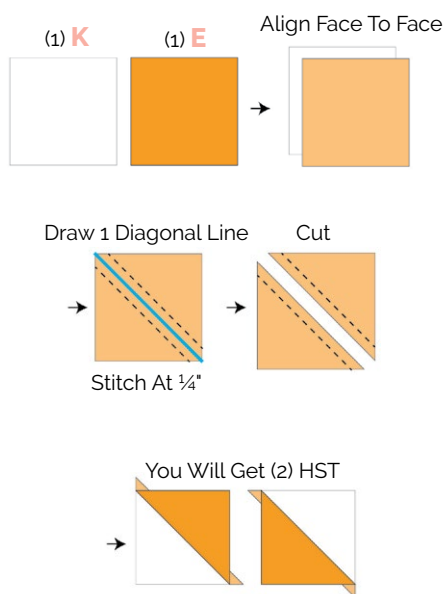


DIAGRAM 2

- For the pillow top you will need the following HST:

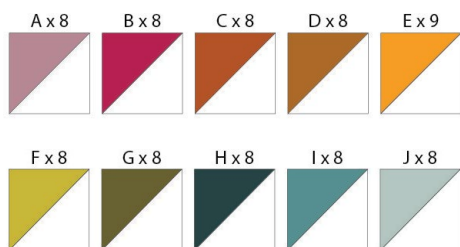


DIAGRAM 3

- Arrange the HST into rows:

Row 1: **G** - **H** - **I** - **J** - **A** - **B** - **C** - **D** - **E**

Row 2: **H** - **I** - **J** - **A** - **B** - **C** - **D** - **E** - **F**

Row 3: **I** - **J** - **A** - **B** - **C** - **D** - **E** - **F** - **G**

Row 4: **J** - **A** - **B** - **C** - **D** - **E** - **F** - **G** - **H**

Row 5: **A** - **B** - **C** - **D** - **E** - **F** - **G** - **H** - **I**

Row 6: **B** - **C** - **D** - **E** - **F** - **G** - **H** - **I** - **J**

Row 7: **C** - **D** - **E** - **F** - **G** - **H** - **I** - **J** - **A**

Row 8: **D** - **E** - **F** - **G** - **H** - **I** - **J** - **A** - **B**

Row 9: **E** - **F** - **G** - **H** - **I** - **J** - **A** - **B** - **C**



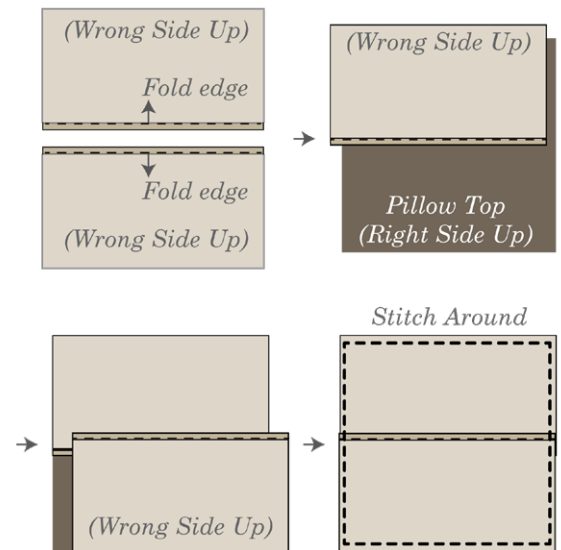
DIAGRAM 4

QUILTING ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the pillow top.

BACK OF THE PILLOW

Sew rights sides together.

- Take both 18½" x 14½" rectangles from fabric **K**.
- Fold one 18½" edge ½" towards the wrong side of the fabric of each rectangle.
- Fold the same edge ½" again and edge stitch the fold in place to have a clean edge.
- Take the quilted pillow top and lay it flat right side up.
- Take one rectangle from fabric **K** and align it wrong side up to the top side of the pillow top.
- Take the other rectangle from fabric **K** and align it wrong side up to the bottom side of the pillow top.
- Pin the three pieces in place and sew around the edges at ¼".
- Clip the corners and flip the piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Fill the pillow with a 18" x 18" pillow form and enjoy!
