# FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A	FUS-BL-1800	3/4 yd.
Fabric B	CAP-SV-11600	½ yd.
Fabric C	CAP-SV-11601	½ yd.
Fabric D	CAP-SV-11606	½ yd.
Fabric E	DEN-L-4000	½ yd.
Fabric F	DEN-S-2006	½ yd.

# CUTTING DIRECTIONS

BACKING FABRIC FUS-BL-1800 (Included)

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

### Fabric A

- Eight (8) 16½" x 1½" strips.
- Two (2) 17½" x 16½" rectangles.

### Fabric B

- Four (4) 4½" squares.
- Two (2) 16½" x 1½" strips.

### Fabric C

- Two (2) 11/2" x WOF strips.
- Two (2) 21/2" x WOF strips.

### Fabric D

• Two (2) 11/2" x WOF strips.

### Fabric E

- Two (2) 1½" x WOF strips.
- Sixteen (16) 2½" squares.

### Fabric F

- Two (2) 11/2" x WOF strips.
- Two (2) 16½" x 1½" strips.

## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with 1/4" seam allowance.

### Center Blocks:

- Start by placing one (1) 2½" square from fabric E at the top left corner of a 4½" square from fabric B.
- Sew diagonally, trim ½" away from seam allowance and press open.
- Place another 2½" square from fabric E to the top right corner of the same 4½" square from fabric B, sew diagonally, trim ¼" away from seam allowance and press open.
- Keep repeating the same steps with the other two (2) 2½" squares from fabric E at the two bottom corners of the 4½" square from fabric B.




DIAGRAM 1

• Sew the four (4) center blocks together.



### Strip Blocks:

- Join one (1) 1½" x WOF strip from fabrics C, E,
  F, D, and one (1) 2½" x WOF strip from fabric
  C.
- Repeat this step one more time.




DIAGRAM 3

- Create a 4½" square cardboard template, place it on top of the strip set previously made by aligning the side corners of the template in between fabric F and D seam, and cut, following the edges of the template.
- Repeat this step to get a total of eight (8) strip blocks.





DIAGRAM 4



- Sew the four (4) strip blocks together by alternating their direction.
- See diagram below for reference.
- Repeat this step one more time.




DIAGRAM 5

- Join two (2) 16½" x 1½" strips from fabric A and one (1) 16½" x 1½" strips from fabric B as shown on diagram below.
- Repeat this step one more time.




DIAGRAM 6

- Join two (2) 16½" x 1½" strips from fabric A and one (1) 16½" x 1½" strips from fabric F as shown on diagram below.
- Repeat this step one more time.




DIAGRAM 7

Arrange pieces as shown on diagram below.



Quilt as desired.





# BACK OF THE PILLOW

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

• Take both  $17\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16" rectangles from fabric A.

- Fold on the top edge ½" towards the wrong side of the fabric of one of the rectangle.
- Fold the same edge ½" again and edge stitch the fold in place to have a clean edge.
- Repeat the same but this time on the top edge of the other piece.
- Take the quilted pillow top and lay it flat right side up.
- Take one rectangle from fabric and align it wrong side up to the right side of the pillow top.
- Take the other rectangle from fabric C and align it wrong side up to the left side of the pillow top.
- Pin the three pieces in place and sew around the edges at <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>".
- Clip the corners and flip the piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Fill the pillow with a 24" × 16" pillow form and enjoy!
