<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

- Sixty four (64) 11/2" squares from fabric A.
- Sixteen (16) 3½" squares from fabric A.
- Two (2)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from fabric A.
- Two (2)  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from fabric A.
- Four (4) 2½" x 1½" rectangles from fabric A.
- Two (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, L, M, O, P.


• One (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric D, J, M, N.

### CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

#### Flying Geese Construction:

- Place a 1½" square from fabric A to the right edge of a 2½" x 1½" rectangle from fabric G mark a diagonal line from the top left corner to the bottom right corner of fabric A square, sew through the line, trim ¼" away from the stitch line and press.
- Take another 1½" square from fabric A and place it to the left edge of the sewn piece, mark a diagonal line from the bottom left corner to the top right corner of fabric A square, sew through the line and trim ¼" away from the stitch line, and press.
- Repeat this step one more time to get a total of two (2) AGA flying geese.

#### BACKING FABRIC

Fabric A DSE-715. (Included)

• Repeat the flying geese method to get the following combinations using  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from fabric A for all  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabrics B, C, D, E, F, H, I, J, K, L, M, O, P.




DIAGRAM 2

• Repeat the flying geese method to get the following combinations with eight (8)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from fabric A and one (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabrics D, M, N and J.





DIAGRAM 3

• Sew all 2½" x 1½" flying geese by columns and

- add one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric **A** to the top and bottom of each column.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 4.



- Join one (1) 3½" square from fabric A to each side of ADA flying geese.
- Repeat the same step for AMA, ANA, and AJA.
- Sew rows together.



• Join one (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A to the top and bottom.



• Sew all columns together.



#### BACK OF THE PILLOW

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

- Take both  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $13\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric A.
- Fold on the top edge ½" towards the wrong side of the fabric of one of the rectangle.
- Fold the same edge  $\frac{1}{2}$ " again and edge stitch the fold in place to have a clean edge.
- Repeat the same but this time on the top edge of the other piece.
- Take the quilted pillow top and lay it flat right side up.
- Take one rectangle from fabric A and align it wrong side up to the right side of the pillow top.
- Take the other rectangle from fabric A and align it wrong side up to the left side of the pillow top.
- Pin the three pieces in place and sew around the edges at 1/4".
- Clip the corners and flip the piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Fill the pillow with a 18" × 18" pillow form and enjoy!


