

#### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A	MAF-79211	<sup>3</sup> ⁄4 yd.
Fabric B	PE-463	F8.
Fabric C	PE-443	¾ yd.
LINING FABRIC		
Fabric C PE-443 (Included)		

#### **ADDITIONAL MATERIALS**

Snap fastener Faux Leather fabric Batting

#### **CUTTING DIRECTIONS**

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

- One (1) 12" x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A.
- One (1) 12"  $\times$  6½" rectangle from fabric **B**.
- One (1) 12" x 30½" rectangle from fabric C.
- One (1) 10" x 2" strip of faux leather.

### CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

• Join one (1) 12" x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A with one (1) 12" x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric B.



DIAGRAM 1

- Place batting on the wrong side of the unit and quilt as desired.
- Fold the piece in half and pin your edges.
- Sew at a ½" seam allowance, backstitching in the beginning and end of each side, leaving the top open.



DIAGRAM 2

 Now, match up the bottom corners to each other and fold, forming a diamond shape.



DIAGRAM 3

 On each diamond shape, measure 2" down from the point and mark a straight line with water soluble pen.




DIAGRAM 4

• Sew a straight line, then cut the excess fabric, leaving 1/4" - 1/2" allowance.




DIAGRAM 5

- Turn your piece inside out.
- Repeat the same processs for the lining from fabric
- When sewing the edges, leave about 2" portion unsewened.
- Now, insert your main lunch bag inside the lining.
- Sew the top part.
- Pull the main fabric through the opening side from the lining.
- Press and steam.




DIAGRAM 6

Take the faux leather 10" x 2" strip and fold the

edges to the center and then fold in half.

• Sew the edges with matching thread.




DIAGRAM 7

- Place the strip 4" down from where fabric A and B meets.
- Top stitch to secure the strap.



DIAGRAM 8

- Roll the top of the lunch bag dow, and calculate where you want the snap fastener to be placed.
- Follow the snap fastener instructions to place the snap on the lunch bag and strip.
- Now, enjoy your lunch bag!.
