## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

| Fabric A | PTC-59705 | $1 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$. |
| :--- | :--- | ---: |
| Fabric B | PTC-59706 | F. |
| Fabric C | PE-438 | $3 / 8 \mathrm{yd}$. |
| Fabric D | PE-471 | $1 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$. |
| Fabric E | PE-452 | $1 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$. |

## ADDITIONAL MATERIAL Steam-a-Seam (Suggested)

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

- Nineteen (19) 4" squares from fabric A.
- One (1) template 2 from fabric B.
- One (1) template 2.2 from fabric B.
- One (1) template 1 from fabric C.
- One (1) template 1.1 from fabric C.
- Twelve (12) 4" squares from fabric C.
- Seven (7) 4" squares from fabric D.
- One (1) $32^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric $D$.
- Two (2) template 3, T4, T5, T6, T7, T8, and T9 from fabric $E$.


## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

## Four at a time HST method:

- Start by placing one (1) 4 " square from fabric A and $C$ right sides together and sew all around the square at $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$.
- Mark diagonal lines corners to corners on the wrong side of the fabric.
- Using your rotary blade, cut the squares following both diagonal drawn lines.
- You should end up with four (4) A-C hst, press each HST and trim to a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- Make a total of forty six (46) A-C hst combination.


DIAGRAM 1

- Repeat the same step with seven (7) 4" squares from fabrics $\mathbf{D}$ and $\mathbf{A}$.
- Make a total of twenty six (26) D-A hst combination.

- Arrange all HST into five (5) rows of six (6) HST each.


DIAGRAM 3

- Make a total of two identical blocks and quilt them.


DIAGRAM 4

- Rotate template 1 about $45^{\circ}$ and cut the block made out of HST by tracing around the template. Repeat the same step with the other block, but use template 1.1


DIAGRAM 5

- Using steam a seam place template 2 and 3.
- Applique templates 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9.
- Place them above $1 / 4$ " above the bottom edgeto allow room for the seam allowance.

- Time to sew in the zipper. Attach a zipper foot to your sewing machine.
- Place a quilted elephant shape panel right side up, then place the zipper face down on top of it.


DIAGRAM 7

- Place the lining right sides down over the top. Stitch along the top edge to secure the panel, zipper and lining together.


DIAGRAM 8

- Repeat the same steps for the second panel and lining. Open out and lightly press.
- Stitch down each side of the zipper (as indicated by the dotted lines in the picture below).
- This secures the panel and lining pieces together and ensures the lining doesn't poke out and get caught in the zipper teeth.


DIAGRAM 9

- Open the zipper halfway. This is essential - don't forget this part! Otherwise you won't be able to turn your zip pouch out once you've stitched the sides.
- Place the panels right sides together and the lining right sides together. Pin and stitch all the way around (as shown by the dotted lines in the picture below), leaving a gap in the lining for turning. Make sure the zipper is folded so the teeth

- Fold the $32^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric $D 1 / 2$ " from the top and bottom, then fold it in half lengthwise, and top stitch.
- fold both short sides about $1 / 2$ " and top stitch.
- Sew the ends of the handle of each side of the bag.
