## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

## Bag Strap:

- Take three (3) 6" $\times$ WOF strips from fabric I.
- Trim the selvage from the edges.
- Join the strips into a really long strip.
- Fold the strip in half to create a center crease.
- Fold the edges towards the center crease and press to have a total of three creases.
- Place a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip of batting on the wrong side of one of the inside rectangles of the strip.
- Fold the outer edges towards the inside covering the batting.

- Join the ends of the strap to make a huge circle.
- Edge stitch the edges of the strap to keep the fabric in place.

## Binding:

- Take one (1) $27^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF rectangle from fabric F.
- Cut it into 2" strips at 45 degrees from the bottom edge.
- Join all the strips to make a really long 2" bias strip.



## Blocks 1 \& 2:

- Take fifteen (15) $2^{1 ⁄ 2}$ " squares from fabrics A and B, fifteen (15) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics C and D and fifteen (15) $3^{1 ⁄ 2 "} \times 1^{1} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $C$ and $D$.
- Block 1: join A to C.
- Block 2: join B to D.

- Take fifteen (15) $3^{1 ⁄ 2 "} \times 1^{1122}$ rectangles from fabrics E and F, and fifteen (15) $4^{1 ⁄ 2 " ~} \times 1 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $E$ and $F$.
- Join them as following the diagram:

- Take fifteen (15) $4^{1} 122^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $G$ and $H$, and fifteen (15) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $G$ and $H$.
- Join them as following the diagram:

- Take fifteen (15) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 1 \times 1 / 2$ " rectangles from fabrics II and J and fifteen (15) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} 122^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics II and J.
- Join them as following the diagram:


Block 1 (x 15)


- Take fifteen ( 15 ) $6^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{112 "}$ rectangles from fabrics $K$ and $L$ and fifteen (15) $7^{1 / 2 "} \times 1^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangles from fabrics K and L .
- Join them following the diagram:

- Take fifteen (15) $7^{1 / 2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $M$ and $N$ and fifteen (15) $8^{1 / 2 "} \times 1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics M and N .
- Join them following the diagram:

## Blocks 3 \& 4:

- Take one (1) block 1 and block 2, one (1) $12^{1 / 2 / 2}$ $\times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics $F$ and 0 , and two (2) $8^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from fabrics F and 0 .
- Join them into blocks 3 and 4 following the diagram:

## Blocks 5, 6 \& 7:

- Take fourteen (14) block 1 and 2 and join them into block 5, 6 and 7:

## Quilt:

- Take blocks 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, one (1) $12^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2 "} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabrics $F$ and $O$, one (1) $20 " \times 62^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $H$, two (2) 10 " $\times 62^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric H, two (2) $14^{\prime \prime} \times 12$ " rectangles from fabric $H$, two (2) $14^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric H and batting.
- Layer them using fabric H as backing and quilt each block separately.

- Take two (2) $13^{1 ⁄ 21}$ " squares from fabric I and two (2) 14 " squares from fabric I.
- Layer them with batting and quilt them.
- Trim each square to $12^{1 / 2}$ ".

## Cut \& clean edges:

- For blocks 5, 6 and 7, measure from the center out $24^{1 / 4}$ " and trim each block so they will be 481/2" long:

## Attaching the strap:

- Take block 6 and the circular bag strap.
- Align the center of the block with the center of the bag strap.
- Pin the strap in place.
- Align the strap with the seam of the vertical strips of the block to keep it straight.
- Double stitch the strap and stop stitching and make a u turn to continue stitching where the diagram indicates.

- Align the top and bottom edge of block 6 and attache the 30 " or longer zipper there.
- Trim the excess zipper.
- Clean the raw edge that is next to the zipper with the binding form fabric F.


Right side out


- Take block 3, 4, quilted rectangles from fabrics O and F, and two (2) 16 " or longer zippers.
- Attach the zippers.
- Clean the raw edges attached to the zipper with the binding.

- Join block 3 to block 5 and block 4 to block 7 aligning the seams of block 3 to the seams of the center of block 5 , and aligning the seams of block 4 to the seams fo the center of block 4 .
- For fabric placement and attachment follow the diagram:

- Align and join the top and bottom edge of block 5 . Clean the raw seam with binding.
- Repeat the same process for block 7.

## Side Pockets:

- Join the other sides of block 3 to block 5 and the other sides of block 4 to block 7 .
- Follow the diagram below to align the seams of block 5 to the seams of block 3 , and the seams of block 7 to the seams of block 4 .
- Clean the inside seams with binding.

- Take the two (2) $12^{1 ⁄ 2 / 2}$ quilted pieces from fabric I.
- Align them wrong sides together with the other edge from blocks 5 and 7 to close in the pockets.

- Join each pocket to each side of block 3 wrong sides together.
- Clean the seams with binding.



## QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.


## BINDING

## Sew rights sides together.

- Stop stitching $1 / 4$ " before the edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B 1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of $45^{\circ}$ and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at $1 / 4$ " of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four corners of the quilt.
