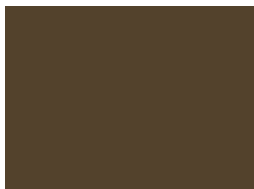

BINDING FABRIC

Fabric **D** SSP-26610 (Included)

Additional Material

- 1 layer Insul Bright batting for potholders.

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¼" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.

- Two (2) 9" squares from fabric **A**.
- Three (3) 9½" x 1½" strips from fabric **A**.
- One (1) 9½" square from fabric **B**.
- One (1) 9½" x 2" strip from fabric **B**.
- One (1) 9½" x 1" strip from fabric **B**.
- One (1) 3½" x 1½" strip from fabric **B** (loop).
- One (1) 9½" square from fabric **C**.
- Two (2) 9½" x 1" strips from fabric **C**.
- One (1) 3½" x 1½" strip from fabric **C** (loop).
- Two (2) 9½" x 2" strips from fabric **D**.
- Two (2) 9½" x 1½" strips from fabric **D**.
- Four (4) 1½" x 10" strips from fabric **D** (pocket binding).
- One (1) 8" x WOF rectangle from fabric **D** (binding).
- One (1) 9½" x 2" strip from fabric **E**.
- One (1) 9½" x 1½" strip from fabric **E**.
- Two (2) 9½" x 1" strips from fabric **F**.
- Two (2) 9" squares from fabric **G**.
- Two (2) 9½" x 2" strips from fabric **G**.
- One (1) 9½" x 1" strip from fabric **H**.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with 1/4" seam allowance.

Pot Holder 1:

- Take three (3) 9 1/2" x 1 1/2" strips from fabric **A**, one (1) 9 1/2" x 2" strip from fabric **B**, one (1) 9 1/2" x 1" strip from fabric **C**, two (2) 9 1/2" x 1" strips from fabric **D**, two (2) 9 1/2" x 2" strips from fabric **D** and join each strip in the following order on the diagram below.

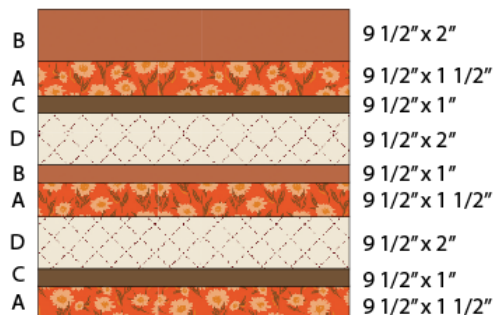


DIAGRAM 1

Pot Holder 2:

- Take two (2) 9 1/2" x 1 1/2" strips from fabric **D**, one (1) 9 1/2" x 2" strip from fabric **E**, one (1) 9 1/2" x 1 1/2" strip from fabric **E**, two (2) 9 1/2" x 1" strips from fabric **F**, two (2) 9 1/2" x 2" strips from fabric **G**, one (1) 9 1/2" x 1" strip from fabric **H** and join each strip in the order shown in the diagram below.

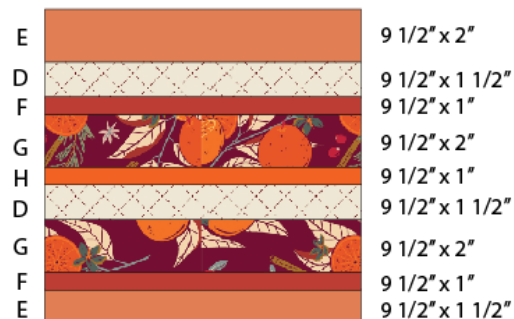


DIAGRAM 2

- Now, layer one (1) 9 1/2" square from fabric **C**, which is the lining (wrong side facing up), 1 layer Insul Bright batting and the pot holder 1 wrong side facing down, pin in place and quilt as desired.
- Repeat the same with pot holder 2 assembled piece, 1 layer Insul Bright batting and one (1) 9 1/2" square from fabric **B**, which will be the lining.
- Quilt your pieces as desired.

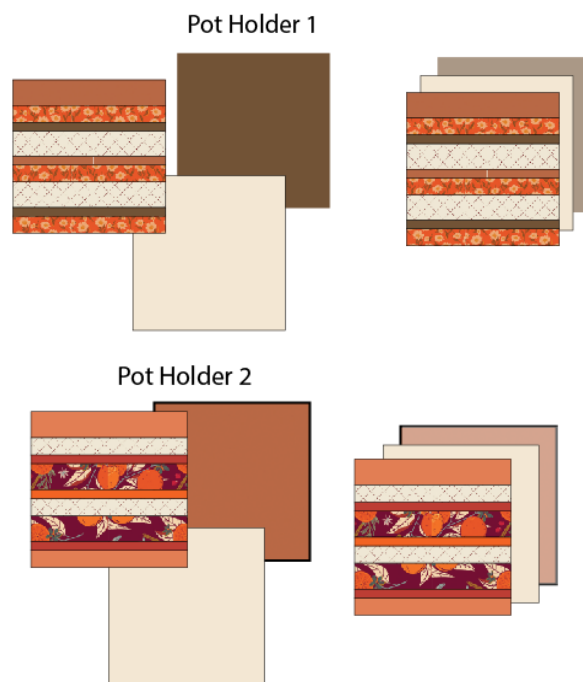


DIAGRAM 3

- Once you quilt pot holder 1 and 2, take template 1 and trace the circle with a water soluble pen.
- Cut your pieces.

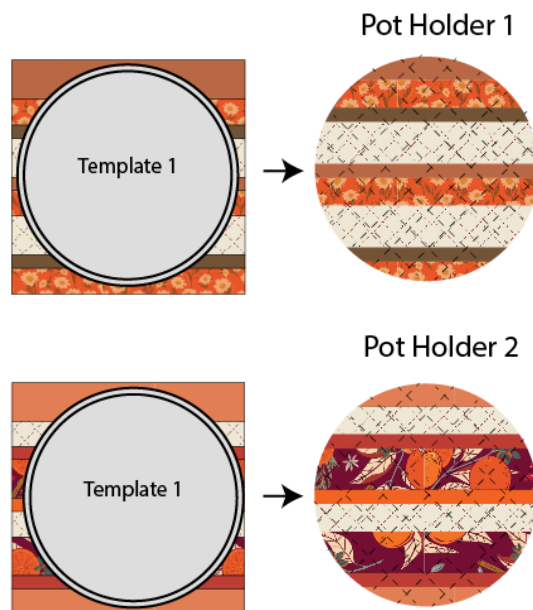


DIAGRAM 4

Create the loop:

- Take one (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric **B** and **C**.
- Fold the edges towards the center for fabric **B** strip and then fold in half.
- Sew the edges with matching thread.
- Repeat the same instructions for fabric **C** loop.

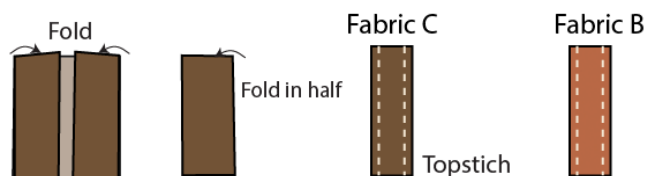


DIAGRAM 4

- Take pot holder 1 making sure fabric **C** is facing up and find the middle point of the circle.
- Fold the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " loop in half and place it with the raw edge touching the raw edge of fabric **C** and on its middle point.
- Stitch on the edge at a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance in order to hold your loop.

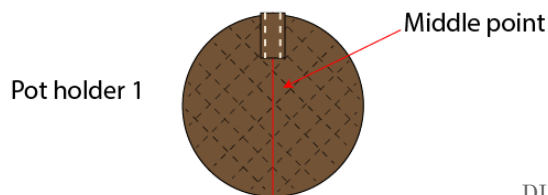


DIAGRAM 5

- Repeat the same with pot holder 2 with fabric **B**.

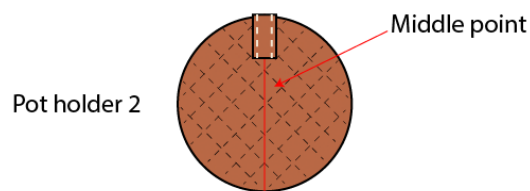


DIAGRAM 6

- Take two (2) 9" squares from fabric **A** and one (1) piece of batting. Layer one (1) 9" square from fabric **A**, wrong side facing up, one (1) 9" square of batting and one (1) 9" square from fabric **A**, wrong side facing down.
- Pin your piece and quilt as desired.
- Then, take template 2 and trace it. Cut your pocket pieces, you will have two (2) pot holder pockets.

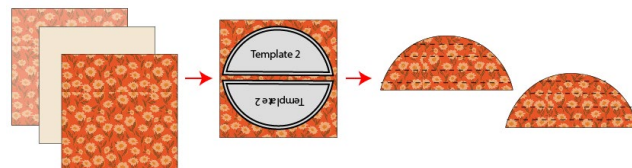


DIAGRAM 7

- Repeat the same process for fabric **G** pot holder pockets. These will be for pot holder 2.



DIAGRAM 8

- Take four (4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10" strips of fabric **D** and bind the straight edges of fabric **A** and fabric **G** pocket pieces.
- Trim excess fabric if needed.

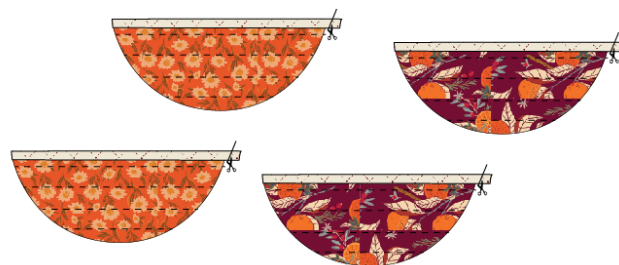


DIAGRAM 9

- To bind your pot holders, you will need to cut your binding on the bias.
- So take a 8" x WOF rectangle from fabric **D** and cut strips at a 45 degree making sure the width its 1½".

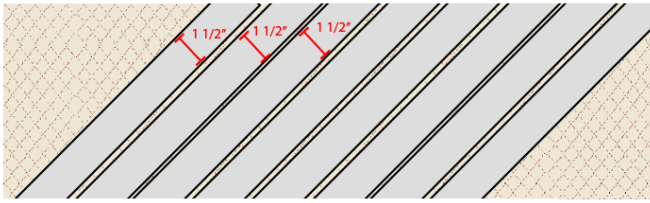


DIAGRAM 10

- Each of your strips now has their edges cut on bias which will work well for stitching them into a continuous strip.



DIAGRAM 11

- Place binding strips right sides together as shown, notice how there will be about $\frac{1}{4}$ " fabric hanging over on each end, this will ensure your binding strips will form one straight continuous binding.
- Sew and trim excess fabric.

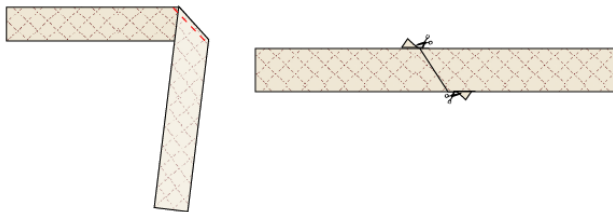


DIAGRAM 12

- Stitch strips of binding together until you have about 30" long binding.
- Fold binding in half lengthwise, wrong sides together. Press with hot iron. Take pot holder 1, fabric **C** facing up and two (2) of fabric **A** pocket pieces and place them on top of the unit making sure the rounded edges are lining up.

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- Pin in place and take your binding fabric and re-pin the binding around the pot holder edge. Sew the binding, overlapping the ends to finish.

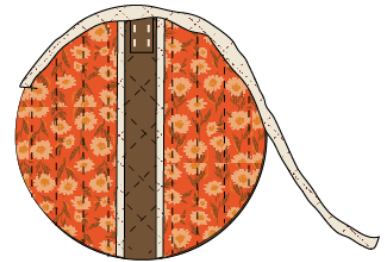


DIAGRAM 13

- Repeat the same for pot holder 2 and enjoy!!!
