## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

> 1/4" seam allowances are included.
> WOF means width of fabric.

- Four (4) $7^{11 / 2 " ~} \times 2^{11 / 2 " ~ s t r i p s ~ f r o m ~ f a b r i c ~ A . ~}$
- Four (4) $11^{1 ⁄ 2 " 2} \times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric B
- Four (4) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2^{11 / 2 "}$ squares from fabric C.
- Four (4) $81 / 2 " \times 2 ½$ "squares from fabric $D$.
- Four (4) $2 ½$ " squares from fabric $E$.
- Four (4) $2 ½$ " squares from fabric F.
- Four (4) $1011 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{11 / 2 "}$ stripsfrom fabric G.
- Four (4) $13^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ stripsfrom fabric H.
- Four (4) $41 ⁄ 2 " \times 2 ½$ " strips from fabric I.
- Four (4) $14^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $13^{1 ⁄ 21} \times 11 / 2$ " strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $11 \frac{112 "}{2 \prime} \times 1^{1122 "}$ strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $101122^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2$ " strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $7 ½$ " $\times 1 ½$ " strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $5^{1 ⁄ 2 " ~} \times 1^{1 ⁄ 21} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric J.
- Four (4) $4^{1 ⁄ 2 " ~} \times 1^{11 / 2 "}$ strips from fabric J.
- Three (3) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips from fabric J.
- One (1) $281 / 2$ " $\times 28^{1 ⁄ 2 " 2}$ square from fabric J.


## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance.

- For the construction of this pillow you'll need to make four (4) log cabin blocks.
- Start bringing one (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square from fabric E \& F.
- Attach them together as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 1

- Now, take one (1) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2 "$ strips from fabric II and attach it to the right side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Attach them together as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Take one ( 1 ) $4^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 22^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric J and attach it to the left side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Take one (1) $5^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric J and attach it to the top side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 4

- Take one (1) $5^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric C and attach it to the bottom side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Take one (1) $7^{1 / 2 "} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ strips from fabric A and attach it to the right side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 6

- Take one (1) $7^{1 / 21} \times 1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric J and attach it to the left side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.
- Take one (1) $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $J$ and attach it to the bottom side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Take one (1) $8^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric D and attach it to the bottom side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 9

- Take one (1) $10^{1 / 2 "} \times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $G$ and attach it to the right side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 10

- Take one (1) $10^{1 / 2 "} \times 2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric J and attach it to the left side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 11

- Take one (1) $11^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 / 2}$ " strips from fabric J and attach it to the top side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 12

- Take one (1) $11^{1 / 2 "} \times 2^{1 / 2 "}$ strips from fabric $B$ and attach it to the bottom side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.


DIAGRAM 13

- Take one (1) $13^{1 / 2 \prime 2} \times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric H and attach it to the right side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Take one (1) $13^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric H and attach it to the right side of the previous made piece as shown in the diagram below.
- Press.

- Repeat the previous steps to construct a total of four (4) log cabin

## QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring it.


DIAGRAM 19

- Take three (3) $2^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ W/OF strips and sew them together on the short edge.
- You should end up with a $125^{\prime \prime}$ strip, subcut it so it ends up measuring 119"
- Add batting and quilt the strip if desired.

DIAGRAM 20

- Take the $28^{1 ⁄ 2}$ " square from fabric $J$ and start sewing the $112^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip all around it.
- Trim the excess fabric and sew the two matching ends of the strip.


DIAGRAM 21

- Place the main block on the other side of the $112^{\prime \prime}$ $\times 2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip, facing right sides together and sew the same way you sew the strip to the $281 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square from fabric $J$ leave an opening that measures around 3 " to 4".


DIAGRAM 22

- Turn the pillow right side out.
- Using pillow stuffing fill up the pillow and close the opening by hand.
- Enjoy.
