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FREE PATTERN

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¹/₄" seam allowance.


- Cut out all your pieces.
- Iron fusible interfacing onto the wrong side of both exterior pieces.
- Quilt your exterior pieces as desired, we chose a simple diagonal grid.
- Use a circular object, such as a plate or bowl to trace the curve of on two corners of each bag piece and cut on the lines you drew.




 Fold your ruffle strip in half long ways right sides together and sew at ¹/₄" down the long raw side.



- Turn your ruffle strip right side out and press flat.
- Sew a basting stitch on the edge of your strip with the seam and gather your strip so it is the same length as three sides of your bag exterior piece, minus the top edge.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS



FOR-47700 WILD POSY FLORA by Bonnie Christine

1% yd.

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¹/₄" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

Four (4) 14" x 16" rectangles for main bag. (exterior & lining)

Two (2) 14" x 2" strips for bag top facing.

Two (2) 30" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for handles.

One (1) 60 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strip for ruffle.

Two (2) 14" x 16" rectangles of lightweight fusible interfacing.

• Pin your ruffle to your bag front sides and bottom with the edge with the seam lining up with the raw edge of your front piece.




- Place your other exterior piece on top, right sides together and sew the two sides and the bottom at 1/4".
- Turn right side out.




- Take the two remaining bag pieces and sew them right sides together on the two sides and the bottom.
- With your bag exterior right sides out and your interior right sides in, insert your exterior inside your interior and line up the raw edges.
- Sew around the opening at ¼", leaving an opening to turn.
- Turn your bag right side out and press your seam flat. Hand sew your opening closed.
- Sew your two bag facing pieces together via the short ends, creating a loop.




- Fold one raw edge of your facing down on the wrong side 1/4"
- Pin your facing to your bag right sides together, lining up the raw edge of your facing with the raw edge of your bag.



• Fold your handle strips in half wrong sides together with the raw edge meeting in the middle, then in half again and sew down the side, creating the handles.



• Insert the ends of your handles in between the facing and bag exterior pieces, lining up the raw edges, about 4" in from each side.



- Sew around the opening at ¹/₄" before flipping your facing and handles up and stitch them down to the facing.
- Your ruffle bag is complete and ready to use.
