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## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A	GRH14402	FQ.
Fabric B	PE423	FQ.
Fabric C	GRH14408	<sup>3</sup> ⁄ <sub>4</sub> yd.
Fabric D	PE449	FQ.
Fabric E	FE545	FQ.
BACK OF PILLOW GRH14408 (Included)		

### CUTTING DIRECTIONS

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

- One (1) 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square from fabric A.
- Two (2) 5<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares from fabric **B**.
- Four (4) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares from fabric **B**.
- Two (2) 20<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 12" rectangles from fabric C (back of pillow).
- Two (2) 7" squares from fabric C.
- Sixteen (16) 3" squares from fabric C.
- Two (2) 7" squares from fabric D.
- Two (2) 5<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares from fabric E.

## CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

#### Half Square Triangle construction

- Take two (2) 5<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares and place them right sides facing.
- Draw a line diagonally corner to corner using a mechanical pencil or frixion pen.
- Stitch at <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from each side of the drawn line.
- Cut along the marked diagonal line.
- Press open and trim to a perfect  $5^{1/2}$ " square.



DIAGRAM 1

 Take fabrics B and E 5<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares and follow the HST construction in order to create a total of four (4) BE pieces.




DIAGRAM 2

#### Magic 8 construction

- Place one (1) 7" square from fabrics C and D right sides facing together.
- Mark a diagonal line across both diagonals on the wrong side of the top fabric square.
- Sew at a ¼" seam allowance on both sides of the marked diagonal lines.




DIAGRAM 3

- Using your rotary cutter, cut the square into eighths.
- You will cut a horizontal line, vertical line, and on both diagonal lines, following the drawn diagonal lines.




DIAGRAM 4

- Open the blocks outward and either lightly finger press or use your iron to lightly press.
- Trim block to 3" x 3".
- Repeat again with the other 7" square from fabrics C and D in order to have a total of sixteen (16) CD squares.



DIAGRAM 5

- Take two (2) CD squares and two (2) 3" squares from fabric C.
- Join one CD square on the right side of one 3" square from fabric C.
- Then take another CD square and join it on the left side of the other 3" square from fabric C.




DIAGRAM 6

- Join both pieces together following the diagram below.




DIAGRAM 7

- Repeat the same construction with the remaining CD squares and 2½" squares from fabric C.
- Create a total of eight (8) blocks.




DIAGRAM 8

- Now, join two (2) of the assembled block following the diagram below.
- Repeat three (3) more times.



#### Snowball Corners Technique

- Take one (1)  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " square from fabric A and four (4)  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from fabric B.
- Place one (1) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square from fabric B on the top left corner of fabric A, right sides facing together.
- Sew at the diagonal and cut leaving <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowance.
- Repeat on the other 3 corners.




DIAGRAM 10

• Take all of your pieces and sew them by rows, following the diagram below.




DIAGRAM 11

- Sew rows 1 through 3.
- Quilt as desired.



# BACK OF PILLOW

- Take both 20½" x 12" rectangles from fabric C.
- Fold one bottom edge ½" towards the wrong side of the fabric of one of the rectangle.
- Fold the same edge ½" again and edge stitch the fold in place to have a clean edge.
- Repeat the same for the top edge of the bottom piece.
- Take the quilted pillow top and lay it flat right side up.
- Take one rectangle from fabric C and align it wrong side up to the right side of the pillow top.
- Take the other rectangle from fabric C and align it wrong side up to the left side of the pillow top.
- Pin the three pieces in place and sew around the edges at 1/4".
- Clip the corners and flip the piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Fill the pillow with a 20" x 20" pillow form and enjoy!


