

Fabric <b>E</b>	BTA21456	¾ yd.
Fabric <b>F</b>	BTA11453	⅝ yd.
Fabric <b>G</b>	BTA11455	¾ yd.
Fabric <b>H</b>	BTA11456	¾ yd.
Fabric <b>I</b>	BTA21452	⅝ yd.
Fabric <b>J</b>	PE522	½ yd.
Fabric <b>K</b>	PE433	3¼ yd.
Fabric <b>L</b>	PE488	¾ yd.

### BACKING FABRIC

BTA11450 8 yds (*Suggested*)

### BINDING FABRIC

Fabric **L** FE488 (*Included*)

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¼" seam allowances are included.  
WOF means width of fabric.

- Forty eight (48) 4" squares from fabric **A**.
- Sixteen (16) 5" x 8¾" rectangles from fabric **A**.
- Thirty two (32) 8¾" x 5" rectangles from fabric **B**.
- Six (6) 8¾" squares from fabric **B**.
- Four (4) 8¾" squares from fabric **C**.
- Four (4) 8¾" squares from fabric **D**.
- Four (4) 8¾" squares from fabric **E**.
- Eight (8) 8¾" squares from fabric **F**.
- Four (4) 8¾" squares from fabric **G**.
- Four (4) 8¾" squares from fabric **H**.
- Sixteen (16) 8¾" x 5" rectangles from fabric **I**.
- Two (2) 8¾" squares from fabric **J**.
- Sixteen (16) 4" squares from fabric **J**.
- One hundred and sixty (160) 4" squares from fabric **K**.
- Twenty (20) 8¾" squares from fabric **K**.
- Nine (9) 2½" x WOF strips from fabric **L** (Binding).





- Repeat the same steps with eight (8) 5" x 8¾" rectangles from fabric **B** and eight (8) 5" x 8¾" rectangles from fabric **I**, placing fabric **B** on top.
- From this combination you will use (1) for row 4 in block 2 and (1) for row 3 in block 1.



### Magic 8 HST Method

- Start by placing one (1) 8¾" square from fabric **D** and **K** right sides together.
- Mark a diagonal line across both diagonals on the wrong side of the top fabric square.
- Sew a ¼" seam on both sides of the marked lines.
- Using your rotary cutter or scissors cut a horizontal line, a vertical line, and on both drawn diagonal lines. See #3 figure.
- Open the blocks outward and lightly press. Be very careful to only press up and down, NOT back and forth to do not stretch them. Your seam should be pressed (both layers) toward the darker color.
- Trim each HST in 4" squares.



Repeat the same step with 8¾" square from following fabric combinations:

- One (1) 8¾" square from fabric **D** with one (1) 8¾" square from fabric **K**.
- Two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **D** with two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **F**.
- Six (6) 8¾" square from fabric **K** with six (6) 8¾" square from fabric **F**.
- Four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **K** with four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **E**.
- Four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **G** with four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **K**.
- Four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **B** with four (4) 8¾" square from fabric **K**.
- Two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **B** with two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **C**.
- Two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **H** with two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **C**.
- Two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **J** with two (2) 8¾" square from fabric **H**.


