CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¼" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.

Pot Holder

- Five (5) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **A**.
- One (1) 18" x 8" rectangle from fabric **B** (binding).
- Two (2) 10" x 1½" strips from fabric **B** (pocket binding).
- One (1) 9" square from fabric **C**.
- Five (5) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **C**.
- One (1) 3½" x 1½" strip from fabric **C** (loop).
- Two (2) 18" x 5" rectangles from fabric **D**.
- Five (5) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **D**.
- Four (4) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **E**.
- Four (4) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **G**.
- One (1) 18" x 8" rectangle from fabric **H** (binding).
- Two (2) 10" x 1½" strips from fabric **H** (pocket binding).
- Four (4) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **J**.
- Two (2) 18" x 5" rectangles from fabric **K**.
- Five (5) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **K**.
- One (1) 9" square from fabric **L**.
- Four (4) 12" x 2" strips from fabric **L**.
- One (1) 3½" x 1½" strip from fabric **L** (loop).

Napkins:

- One (1) 15½" square from fabric **F**.
- Four (4) heart template from fabric **F**.
- One (1) 15½" square from fabric **I**.
- Four (4) heart template from fabric **I**.
- Two (2) 15½" x 3½" rectangles from fabric **J**.

Pot Holders Construction

- Start by taking all of your 12" x 2" strips from fabrics **A**, **C**, **D**, **E**, **G**, **J**, **K** and **L** and fold the edges 1/2" towards the center making sure the wrong side of the fabric is hidden.
- Press

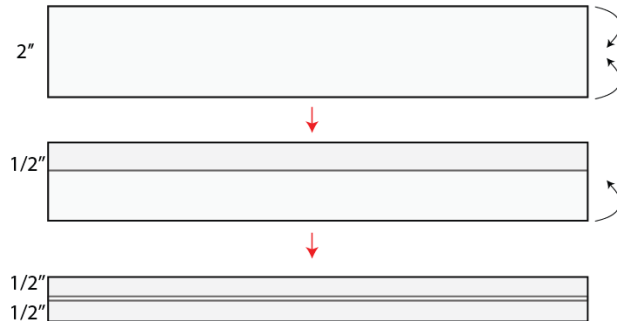


DIAGRAM 1

Pot Holder 1

- Take a 9" x 9" foam-board and draw two intersecting guide lines meeting in the center.
- Take a piece of fusible interfacing bigger than the foam board and place it on top of the foam-board with the fusible side looking up.
- Take one (1) strip from fabric **A**, place it on top of the fusible interfacing aligned to the horizontal line. Use pins on both ends to secure the strips in place.
- Take another strip from fabric **A**, and place it next to the previous strip making sure you leave no space in between the fabric strips and pin it.

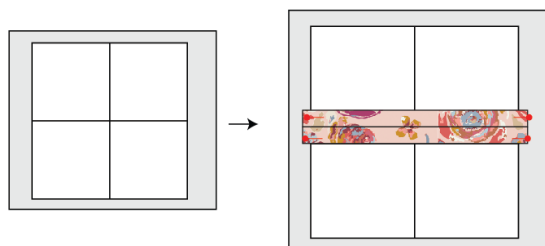


DIAGRAM 2

- Take the remaining strips from fabric **A** and **L** and place them in the order shown on the diagram below.

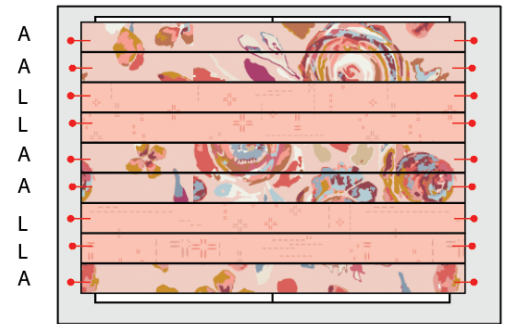


DIAGRAM 3

- Now, start weaving fabrics **D** and **E** between the strips of fabrics **A** and **L** on the perpendicular vertex.
- Follow the diagram below for each fabric placement.
- Pin the strips to hold them in place.

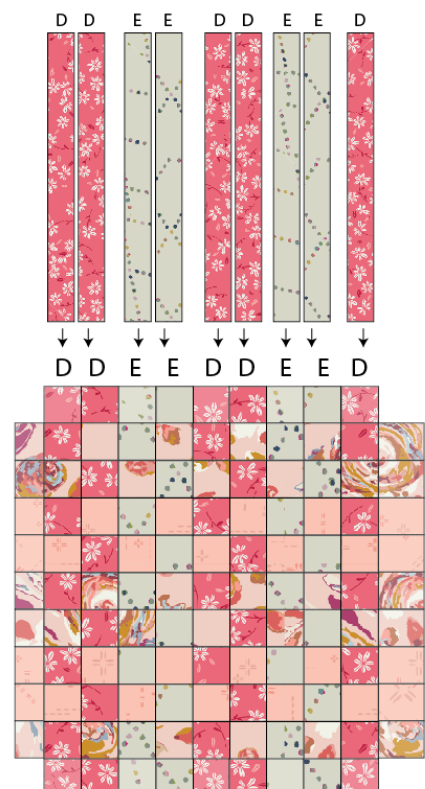


DIAGRAM 4

- Once finished, tape the edges with masking tape and remove the pins.
- Press the fusible interfacing to the fabrics gluing it all together.
- Take template 1 and place it on top of the weaved piece and using a fabric pen trace your template circle.
- Remove the piece from the foam board and sew at $\frac{1}{8}$ " in from the marked line, that way you secure better the piece and then cut at the marked line.

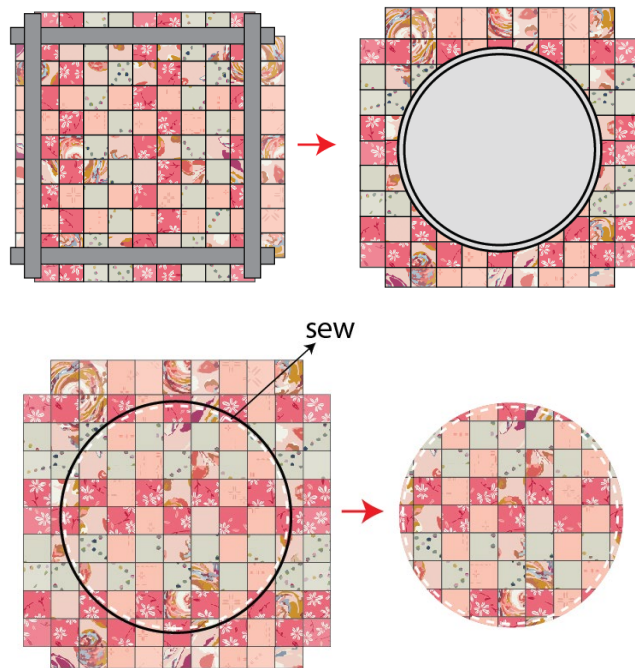


DIAGRAM 5

Pot Holder 2

- Take the same 9" square foam-board that you previously used.
- Take a piece of fusible interfacing bigger than the foam board and place it on top of the foam-board with the fusible side looking up.
- Take one (1) strip from fabric **C**, place it on top of the fusible interfacing aligned to the horizontal line.
- Take another strip from fabric **C**, and place it next to the previous strip making sure you leave no space in between the fabric strips and pin it.

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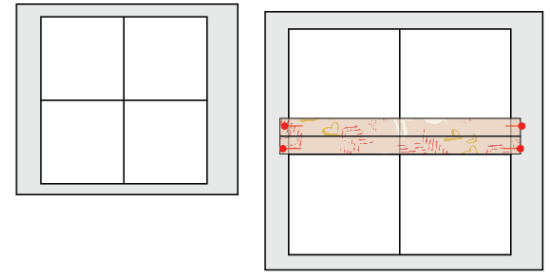


DIAGRAM 6

- Take the remaining strips from fabric **C** and **G** and place them following the diagram below.

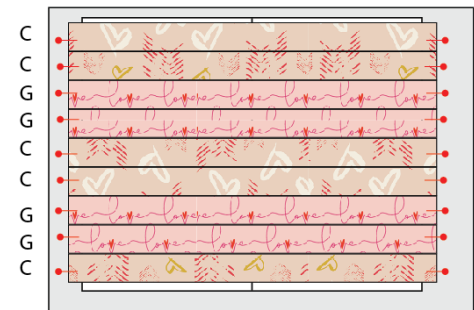


DIAGRAM 7

- Now, start weaving fabrics **J** and **K** between the strips of fabrics **C** and **G** on the perpendicular vertex.
- Follow the diagram below for each fabric placement.
- Pin the strips to hold them in place.

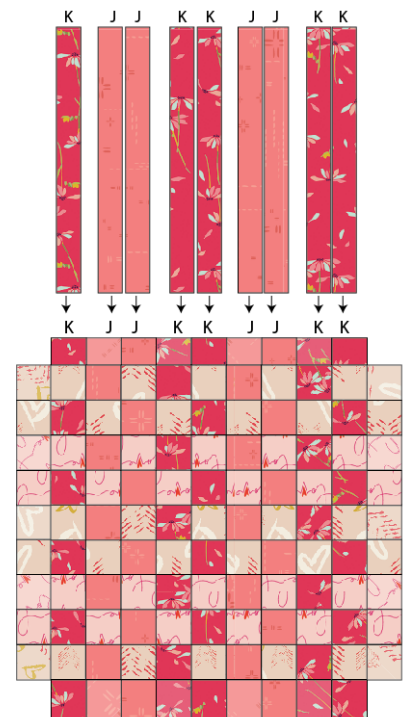


DIAGRAM 8

- Once finished, tape the edges with masking tape and remove the pins.
- Press the interfacing to the fabrics gluing it all together.
- Take template 1 and place it on top of the weaved piece and using a fabric pen trace your template circle.
- Remove the piece from the foam board and sew at $\frac{1}{8}$ " in from the marked line that way you secure better the piece and then cut at the marked line.

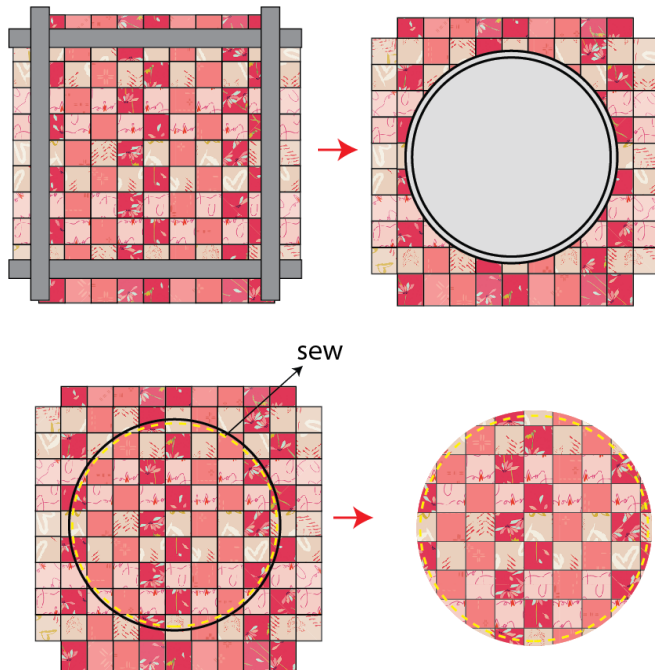


DIAGRAM 9

Creating the loop:

- Take one (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric **C** and **L**.
- Fold the edges to the center for fabric **C** strip and then fold in half.
- Sew the edges with matching thread.
- Repeat the same process for fabric **L** strip.

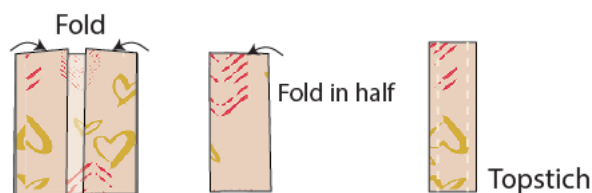


DIAGRAM 10

- Take one (1) 9" square from fabric **C** and a piece of insulated batting and quilt as desired.
- Take template 1, trace and cut your piece.

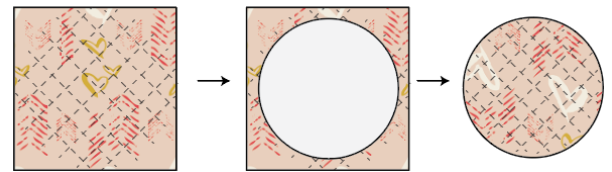


DIAGRAM 11

- Fold the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " loop in half to create a loop and place it with the raw edge touching the raw edge of fabric **C** and on its middle point.
- Stitch on the edge at a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance in order to hold your loop.

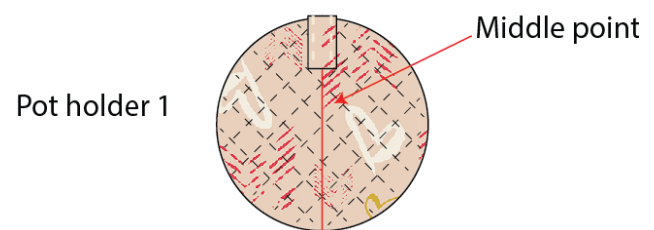


DIAGRAM 12

- Repeat the same process for pot holder 2 with fabric **L**.

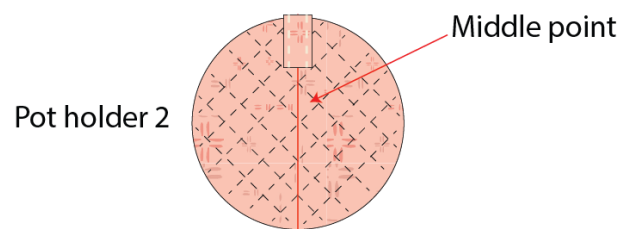


DIAGRAM 13

- Place fabric **C** piece and pot holder 1 wrong sides facing together and baste stitch all around.
- Repeat the same for pot holder 2 and fabric **L** piece.

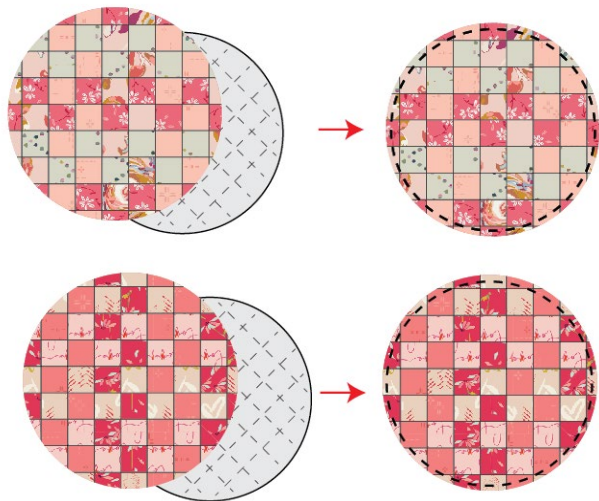


DIAGRAM 14

- Take two (2) 18" x 5" rectangles from fabric **K** and one (1) piece of batting. Layer one (1) rectangle from fabric **K**, wrong side facing up, one (1) rectangle of batting and another rectangle from fabric **K**, wrong side facing down.
- Pin your pieces and quilt as desired.
- Then, take template 2 and trace it. Cut your pocket pieces, you will have two (2) pot holder pockets.

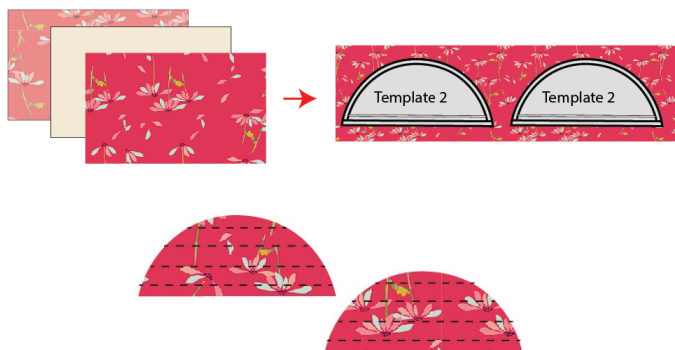


DIAGRAM 15

- Repeat the same process for fabric **D** pot holder pockets. These will be for pot holder 2.



DIAGRAM 16

- Take two (2) 10" x 1½" strips of fabrics **B** and **H** and bind the straight edges of fabric **D** and fabric **K** pocket pieces.
- Trim excess fabric if needed.

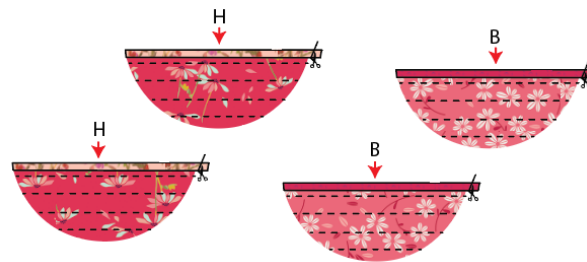


DIAGRAM 17

- To bind your pot holders, you will need to cut your binding on the bias.
- So take a 18" x 8" rectangle from fabrics **B** and **H** and cut strips at a 45° making sure the width is 1½".



DIAGRAM 18

- Each of your strips now has their edges cut on bias which will work well for stitching them into a continuous strip.



DIAGRAM 19

- Place binding strips right sides together as shown on diagram 20, notice how there will be about ¼" fabric hanging over on each end, this will ensure your binding strips will form one straight continuous binding.
- Sew and trim excess fabric.



DIAGRAM 20

- Stitch strips of binding together until you have about 30" long binding.
- Fold binding in half lengthwise, wrong sides together. Press with hot iron.
- Take pot holder 1, fabric **C** facing up and two (2) of fabric **K** pocket pieces and place them on top of the unit making sure the rounded edges are lining up.
- Pin in place and take your binding fabric and re-pin the binding around the pot holder edge. Sew the binding, overlapping the ends to finish.

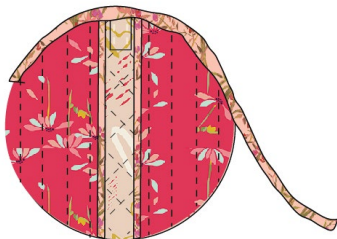


DIAGRAM 21

- Repeat the same for pot holder 2.

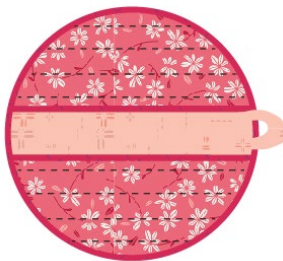


DIAGRAM 22

Napkins Construction

- Take one (1) 15½" x 3½" rectangle from fabric **J** and place steam a seam to four (4) heart cutouts from fabric **I**.
- Distance each heart in an even distance and place them on top of fabric **J** and about ½" away from the edges.
- Once you are satisfied with the placement, apply hot iron pressing carefully.
- Edge stitch each piece with a blanket stitch or desired top stitch.



DIAGRAM 23

- Cut a 15" x 3" rectangle of steam-a-seam and place it on the wrong side of fabric **J** rectangle.
- Fold the top and bottom edge at a ¼" towards the wrong side of the fabric and iron it.
- Now place it on top of the 15½" rectangle from fabric **F** at a 2" distance from the bottom and edge stitch the top and bottom of fabric **J** piece.
- Iron the piece carefully so the steam-a-seam sticks to fabric **C**.

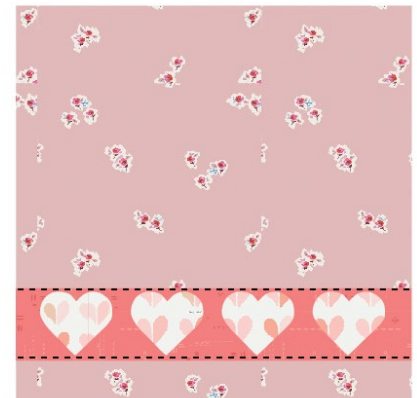
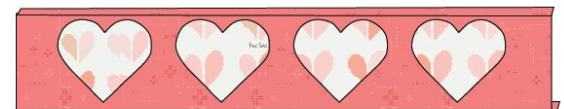


DIAGRAM 24

- Finish the hem of your napking by doing a baby hem all around fabric **F**.

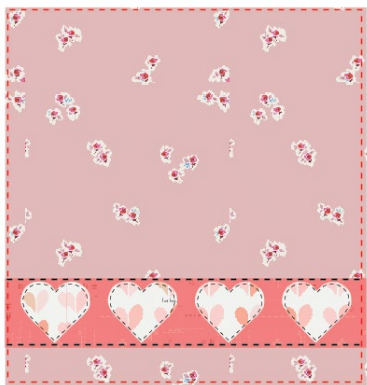


DIAGRAM 25

- Repeat the same instructions in order to complete the second napkin. Enjoy!

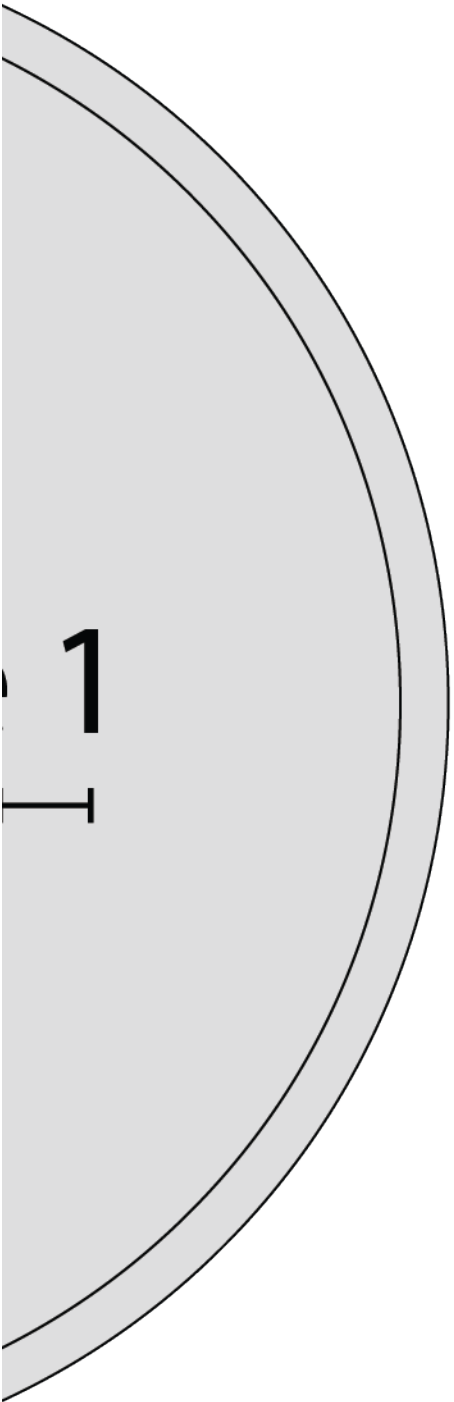
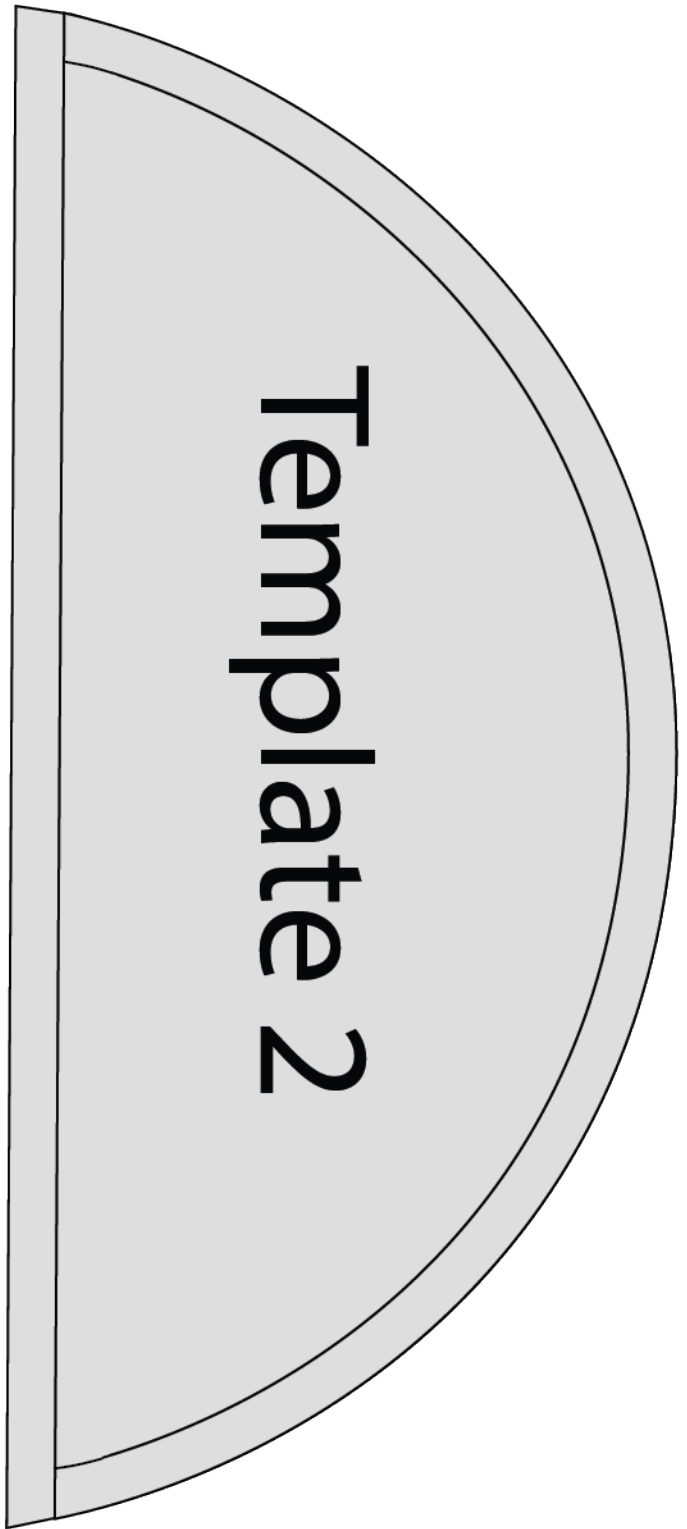
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
