FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A	WIDE-10201	5∕8 yd.
Fabric B	WIDE-10202	5⁄≈ yd.
Fabric C	PE-454	1¾ yd.

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¹/₄" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of fabric.

Before cutting the fabric, start by layering fabric A, batting and fabric B. Quilt them as desired.

Follow diagram 1 as a visual guide to cut the rectangles from the AB quilted piece.

- One (2) 46¹/₂" x 6" rectangles from the AB quilted piece.
- One (1) 47¹/₂" x 11¹/₂" rectangle from the AB quilted piece.
- Two (2) 14¹/₂" x 9¹/₂" rectangles from the AB quilted piece.
- Two (2) 17" x 9¹/₂" rectangles from the AB quilted piece.
- Three (3) 6" x WOF strips from fabric C.
- One (1) 27 x WOF rectangle from fabric C.





DIAGRAM 1

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with 1/4 "seam allowance.

Bag Strap:

- Take three (3) 6" x WOF strips from fabric C.
- Trim the selvage from the edges of each strip..
- Join the three strips into a really long strip.
- Fold the edges towards the center crease and press to have a total of three creases.
- Place a 1¹/₂" strip of batting on the wrong side of one of the inside rectangles of the strip.
- Fold the outer edges towards the inside covering the batting.




- Edge stitch the edges of the strap to keep the fabric in place.
- IF you want, do two extra stitches to decorate.
- Join the ends of the strap to make a huge loop. Make sure the strap is not twisted before joining.




Binding:

- Take one (1) 27" x WOF rectangle from fabric C.
- Cut it into 2" strips at 45 degrees from the bottom edge.
- Join all the strips to make a really long 2" bias strip.



Body of the bag:

- Take the 47¹/₂" x 11¹/₂" rectangle and the bag strap.
- Align the center of the rectangle with the center of the bag strap.
- Pin the strap in place at 1" from the side edges of the rectangle and stop 5" before the top and bottom edges of the rectangle.
- Stitch the straps in place and reinforce at the end the stitching with an extra stitched square.
- For fabric placement an attachment follow diagram 5.




- Take one (1) 12" or longer zipper.
- Align the top and bottom edge of the rectangle and attach the zipper there.
- Clean the raw edge that is next to the zipper with the binding form fabric C.



Block 1 (x2):

- Take two (2) 9½ x 17" rectangles and two (2) 10" or longer zippers.
- Cut one rectangle into one (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and one (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle.
- Repeat the same thing with the other rectangle.
- Attach the zipper between the rectangles and clean the raw edges with binding.




- The final rectangles should measure 9½" x 14½". If they are longer than 14½" trim the bottom part.
- With a fabric pen, draw one notch on the center of the top and bottom edge.



Pocket (x2)

- Take two (2) 46¹/₂" x 6" rectangles and two (2) block 1.
- Join the small edges of each rectangle face to face making them into loops. Clean the edge with binding.
- Join block 1 to the left side of the rectangle loop making sure the top and bottom center of the loop are aligned with the top and bottom notches of block 1.
- Clean the raw edges with binding and turn the pocket inside out.





- Join the pockets to the center piece wrong sides together.
- Bind the outside raw edges by hand.
