- Four (4) $7^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Four (4) 6" $\times 2$ " rectangles.
- Four (4) $41122^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ " rectangles.
- Four (4) 3" $\times 2$ " rectangles.
- Four (4) 15 " $\times 2$ " rectangles.

- Four (4) $71122^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Eight (8) $4^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Eight (8) 2" squares.
- Fabric D
- Four (4) 12 " $\times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Four (4) $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{11 / 2 "}$ rectangles.
- Four (4) $7^{1 ⁄ 21} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Four (4) 6" $\times 2$ "rectangles.
- Four (4) $412^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
- Four (4) 3" $\times 2$ " rectangles.

- Eight (8) $4 ½ " \times 2$ " rectangles.

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1⁄" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.

## Pillow 1

Sew all rights sides together with ¼" seam allowance.

## Construction of Block 1:

- Join one (1) 2 " square from fabric $A$ with one $3^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $B$.
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) $4 ½ " \times 3$ " rectangle from fabric $B$ right sides together to the bottom of the previosly sewn piece (Fig 2).
- Follow the diagram below

- Sew one (1) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " from fabric A on each side of the previously sewn piece ( Fig 4).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) 6" $\times 2$ " rectangle from fabric $B$ with one (1) 2 " square from fabric $A$.
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew the last piece (Fig 8) right sides together to the upper part of the previously sewn piece (Fig 6).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 5

- Sew one (1) $711 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $A$ right sides together onto the bottom of the previously sewn piece ( fig 10).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) $71 / 2 \times 3^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $B$ right sides together onto the left side of the previously sewn piece (fig 12).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 7

- Sew one (1) $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric B onto the bottom part of the previously sewn piece (Fig 14).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 8

- Sew one (1) $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric A right sides together onto the top of the previously sewn piece (Fig 16).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) $12^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $B$ right sides together onto the right side of the previously sewn piece (Fig 18).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 10

- Sew one (1) $12^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " rectangle from fabric $A$ right sides together onto the left side of the previously sewn piece (Fig 20).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 11

- Sew one (1) $15^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " rectangle from fabric $A$ right sides together onto the bottom of the previously sewn piece (Fig 22).
- Follow the diagram below.

## Construction of Block 2:

- Join one (1) 3" $\times 2$ " rectangle from fabric B with one (1) 2" square from fabric $A$

- Sew one (1) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $B$ right sides together to the bottom of the previosly sewn piece (Fig 2).
- Follow the Diagram below.

DIAGRAM 16

- Sew two (2) $4 ½ " \times 2$ " rectangles from fabric $A$ on each side of the previously sewn piece (Fig 4).
- Follow the Diagram below.

- Sew one (1) 2" square from fabric A with one (1) $6 " \times 2$ " square from fabric $B$.
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 18

- Sew the last piece ( Fig 8) right sides
together to the upper part of the previously sewn piece (Fig 6).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 19

- Sew one (1) $71 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $A$ right sides together onto the bottom of the previously sewn piece (fig 10).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 20

- Sew one (1) $71 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric B right sides together onto the right side of the previously sewn piece ( fig 12).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) $101 / 2$ " $\times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric B onto the bottom part of the previously sewn piece (Fig 14).

- Sew one (1) $10^{11 / 2 "} \times 2$ " rectangle from fabric A right sides together onto the top of the previously sewn piece (Fig 16).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 23

- Sew one (1) $12^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric B right sides together onto the left side of the previously sewn piece (Fig 18).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) $12^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle from fabric $A$ right sides together onto the right side of the previously sewn piece (Fig 20).
- Follow the diagram below.


DIAGRAM 25

- Sew one (1) 15" $\times 2$ "rectangle from fabric A right sides together onto the bottom of the previously sewn piece (Fig 22).
- Follow the diagram below.

- Sew one (1) 15 " $\times 2$ "rectangle from fabric B onto the upper part of the previously sewn piece (Fig 24).
- Follow the diagram below.

- You will need two (2) Block 2

## Constructing your Floor pillow:

- You will need two (2) Blocks 1 and two (2) blocks 2.
- Sew one (1) Block 1 and one (1) Block 2 together as shown on the diagram.
- Repeat this one (1) more time.


DIAGRAM 29

- Once you have the two (2) sets sewn, only one (1) needs to be rotated $180^{\circ}$ so that it looks mirrored.
- Follow diagram below.

- Sew the two sets together to complete your floor pillow.


DIAGRAM 30

- Quilt as desired.
- Cut one (1) 30" $\times 30$ " square from fabric B and sew around the pillow top leaving a space to turn inside out.
- Once is made put your stuffing and close the opening.
- Your Floow pillow is ready to enjoy.
- Follow the same instructions to make your second floor pillow with fabrics C and D.


## PILLOW ASSEMBY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.
