Steam A Seam (Double sided fusible interfacing) (Suggested)

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

1/4" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

Fabric A

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 16 (sixteen) 4" squares, then,
 - 1 (one) Heart template.
 - 2 (two) M template.
 - 1 (one) O template.

Fabric B

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric C

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric D

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric E

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
- Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric F

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric G

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric H

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric I

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric J

- Cut 4 (four) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 20 (twenty) 4" squares.

Fabric K

- Cut 3 (three) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 14 (fourteen) 4" squares.

Fabric L

- Cut 3 (three) 22" x 4" strips.
 - Sub-cut into 15 (fifteen) 4" squares.

Fabric M

- Cut 33 (thirty three) 1½" x WOF strips.
- Sub-cut into 900 (nine hundred) 1½" squares.

Fabric N

Cut 6 (six) 2½ "x WOF strips. (Binding)

Steam A Seam (Suggested):

- 1 (one) Heart template.
- 2 (two) M template.
- 1 (one) O template.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼" seam allowance.

Snow Ball Blocks:

- Start by placing 1 (one) 1½" squares from fabric
 M on the left top corner of a 4" square from fabric

 A.
- Sew diagonally and trim ½ away from seam allowance. Press open.
- Place another 1 (one) 1½" square from fabric M to the top right corner of the same 4" square from fabric A, sew diagonally, trim ¼" away from seam allowance and press open.
- Keep repeating the same steps with the other 2 (two) 1½" squares from fabric M on the two bottom corners of the 4" square from fabric A. This will be block 1. Make a total of 16 (sixteen) block 1.




DIAGRAM 1

 Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric B and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 2. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 2.



DIAGRAM 2

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric C and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 3. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 3.



DIAGRAM 3

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric D and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 4. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 4.



DIAGRAM 4

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric **E** and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 5. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 5.



DIAGRAM 5

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric F and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 6. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 6.



DIAGRAM 6

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric G and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 7. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 7.

DIAGRAM 7

Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric H and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 8. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 8.



DIAGRAM 8

Using steam a seam place one (1) Template M from fabric A on top of 1 (one) block 8. Repeat this step one more time. You should have 2 (two) blocks 8M. Do a blanket stitch all around the M temlate from fabric A to secure the piece to block 8.




DIAGRAM 9

Using steam a seam place 1 (one) Template O from fabric A on top of 1 (one) block 8. This will be block 80. Do a blanket stitch all around the O template from fabric A to secure the piece to block 8.



DIAGRAM 10

Using steam a seam place 1 (one) Heart Template from fabric A on top of 1 (one) block 8. This will be block 8H. Do a blanket stitch all around the heart template from fabric A to secure the piece to block 8.



DIAGRAM 11

 Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric I and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 9. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 9.

DIAGRAM 12

 Repeat the same snowball technique with 20 (twenty) 4" squares from fabric J and 80 (eighty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 10. Make a total of 20 (twenty) block 10.



DIAGRAM 13

 Repeat the same snowball technique with 14 (fourteen) 4" squares from fabric K and 56 (fifty six) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 11. Make a total of 14 (fourteen) block 11.


Repeat the same snowball technique with 15 (fifteen) 4" squares from fabric L and 60 (sixty) 1½" squares from fabric M. This will be block 12. Make a total of 15 (fifteen) block 12.

Arrange all blocks into 15 (fifteen) rows of 15 (fifteen) blocks each. See diagram below for reference.



Sew all rows together.



Quilt as desired.



QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.

BINDING


Sew rights sides together.

• Cut enough strips 2½" wide by the width of the fabric N to make a final strip 224" long and fold the strip length-wise. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one side of the quilt leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ¼" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge. • Stop stitching ½" before the edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B 1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of 45° and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal

fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at ½" of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four

corners of the quilt.

- Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pencil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the quilt, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.




