



 To maximize the usage of fabrics A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H and I follow diagram 1 for cutting instructions.



Fabric M

• Cut 8 (eight) 21/2" x WOF strips. (BINDING).

CONSTRUCTION

3Yds

Read through all instructions before beginning. Sew all rights sides together with ½ "seam allowance unless otherwise stated.

Half Square Triangle (HST) Construction.

Magic 8 Construction:

- Start by placing 1 (one) 10³/₄" square from fabrics A and L right sides together.
- Mark a diagonal line across both diagonals on the wrong side of the top fabric square (Fig. 1)







DIAGRAM 3

• Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam on each side of each diagonal line and press the sewn square to set the seams. To separate the square into eight units you will be making four cuts: a vertical cut, a horizontal cut, and two diagonal cut. As you make the cuts, don't rotate the fabric or your pieces may shift position. Instead, rotate the mat or walk around it.






DIAGRAM 4

- Open the pieces outward and lightly press. Be very careful to only press up and down, NOT back and forth so as not to stretch them. Your seam should be pressed (both layers) toward the darker color.
- Trim each half square triangle (HST) to a 4½" square.
- Repeat this steps with the remaining 1 (one) 10³/₄" squares from fabrics A and L. You should end up with sixteen (16) AL half square triangles (HST) units.






DIAGRAM 5

- Repeat The Magic 8 Method one more time with 2 (two) 10¾" squares from fabrics B and L.
- Make (16) sixteen BL (HST) units.



• Make (16) sixteen CL (HST) units.




DIAGRAM 7

- Repeat The Magic 8 Method one more time with 2 (two) 10¾" squares from fabrics D and L.
- Make (16) sixteen DL (HST) units.




DIAGRAM 8

- Make (16) sixteen EL (HST) units.



- Make (16) sixteen FL (HST) units.



• Make (16) sixteen GL (HST) units.



- Make (16) sixteen HL (HST) units.



- Make (16) sixteen IL (HST) units.





DIAGRAM 13

- Make 24 (twenty four) JL (HST) units. there will be 6 (six) unused units.



- Repeat The Magic 8 Method one more time with three (3) 10¾" squares from fabrics K and L.
- Make 24 (twenty four) KL (HST) units. there will be 6 (six) unused units.



























QUILT TOP

Sew all rights sides together with ¼"seam allowance. Press open.

 Arrange pieces into 6 rows of six blocks each and sew together in the order shown on the diagram below.



• Once all rows are completed, sew Row 1 to Row 2, then continue attaching each subsequent row until all six rows are joined together. (See Diagram 35).



QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.

BINDING

Sew rights sides together.


- Cut enough strips 2½" wide by the width of the fabric M to make a final strip 300" long. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the quilt, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ¼" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge.
- Stop stitching ¼" before the edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B 1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of 45° and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at ¼" of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four corners of the quilt.

• Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help

• Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the quilt, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.
