

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Please ensure that all fabrics are ironed thoroughly before cutting them. ¹/₄" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

Fabric A

- Cut one (1) template 1.
- Cut two (2) 6¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" rectangles.

Fabric B

• Cut two (2) template 1.

Fabric C

- Cut one (1) 12¹/2" x 24¹/2" rectangle.
- Cut Four (4) template 2.

Fabric D

- Cut one (1) template 1.
- Cut one (1) 6¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" rectangle.

Fabric E

• Cut one (1) 6¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" rectangle.

Sew all rights sides together with ¼" seam allowance.


- Take 2 (two) 6½" x 12½" rectangles from fabric A, 1 (one) 6½" x 12½" rectangle from fabric D and E. Attach them together creating a 12½" x 24½" panel.
- Refer to the diagram below for correct fabric placement and attachment.



DIAGRAM 1

- Add a layer of batting under the interior panel and if you want to create a quilt design to the interior of your doll house, now is the best time to do it, Be playful!
- Use template 1 from fabrics A and D as the the ceiling. If you want to quilt it place a piece of batting under and get creative.
- Attatch the ceiling to the interior panel. Refer to the diagram below for correct fabric placement.

CREATING THE INDOOR PANEL

- Now the fun should start! You will see in the pages below the pieces corresponding to each room.
- Use steam a seam or double sided fusible interfacing to attach it to each piece of the house. It will be easier for you to place them.
- Top stitch all of the pieces to hold them in place.
- Feel free to use the color of fabric you want for each figure or use the image below as an example for fabric placement.
- Have fun attaching the furniture. For example, we used velcro on the pillows so there is a bit of movement in the house. We created 3D curtains by gathering fabric. We even created a small doll for the house. Just use your imagination to make this project fun and really cute!



CREATING THE OUTDOOR PANEL

Sew rights sides together.

- Once the inside of the house is ready, start with fabric C 12½" x 24½" rectangle and both template 1 from fabric B.
- Attach each template 1 from fabric B to both sides of the 12½" x 24½" rectangle from fabric C. Refer to diagram to attach them properly.
- Use a medium weight fusible interfacing in one side of the handles to give stability. Place 2 (two) Template 2 RST and sew along the curves, leaving the short edges open and turn them inside out.
- Center the short edges of the handle on template 1 from fabric **B** and sew them. See diagram below for fabric placement.
- Quilt as desired.





DIAGRAM 4

• Use the templates provided below to fuzzy cut the outer parts of the house (door, windows, etc). Use steam a seam or double side fusible interfacing and top stitch them to hold them in place.



FINAL ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

- Place both inner and outer part of the house right sides together and stitch all the way around at ¹/₄" seam allowance.
- Leave a 5" opening and flip inside out.
- You should be done! Let the fun start!






