



BACKING FABRIC

Fabric **A, B, C** and **D** (Included)

BINDING FABRIC

Fabric **I** BINTAN69 (Included)

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Please ensure that all fabrics are ironed thoroughly before cutting them. ¼" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

Fabric A

- Cut 2 (two) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) ¾" x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) 1½" x WOF strip.

Fabric B

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 4 (four) ¾" x WOF strips.

Fabric C

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 4 (four) ¾" x WOF strips

Fabric D

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 4 (four) ¾" x WOF strips

Fabric E

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.

Fabric F

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.
-Sub-cut 1 (one) 2½" x WOF strip, into 2 (two) 2½" x 12½" strips.

Fabric G

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.

Fabric H

- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips.

Fabric I

- Cut 5 (five) 2½" x WOF strips. (Binding for all the placemats).

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼" seam allowance.

Keep in mind that for the Placemat #1 we are using linen from fabric A which has 52" WOF.

Placemat #1

- Take 1 (one) 2½" x WOF strip from fabric **F** and 1 (one) 2½" x 12½" strip from fabric **F** and sew them right sides together. We will call these Strip set 1. (SS1)
- Make 2 (two) SS1.




DIAGRAM 1

- Join 2 (two) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips from fabric **A** and 2 (two) SS1 from fabric **F**, alternating the colors.



DIAGRAM 2

- Using a rotary cutter and a clear ruler cut 15 (fifteen) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10" **A-F** vertical strips. We will call these strip unit 1.




DIAGRAM 3

- Flip 3 (three) SU1 pieces horizontally and sew them right sides together.
- We will call these SS2.
- Make 5 (five) SS2.




DIAGRAM 4

- Take 1 (one) SS2 and 1 (one) $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **A** and sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 1.
- Make 4 (four) section 1.




DIAGRAM 5

- Measure 3" from the left edge of 1 (one) Section 1 and make a mark. Then match the left short end of 1 (one) Section 1 with the mark made on the other Section 1 and sew them right sides together. We will call this Section 2.




DIAGRAM 6

- Measure $\frac{3}{4}$ " on the bottom left of Section 2 and make a mark, then take 1 (one) Section 1 and edge match it to the mark made on Section 2. Sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 3.




DIAGRAM 7

- Measure $\frac{3}{4}$ " on the bottom left of Section 3 and make a mark, then take 1 (one) Section 1 and edge match it to the mark made on Section 3. Sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 4.




DIAGRAM 8

- Measure 3" on the bottom left of Section 4 and make a mark, then take 1 (one) SS1 and edge match to the mark made on Section 4. Sew them right sides together.




DIAGRAM 9

- Measure 11½" x 20½" rectangle for your placemat and trim.




DIAGRAM 10

- Use the remaining of fabric **A** as backing and quilt as desired.
- Use the 2.5 Binding to bind each placemat.




DIAGRAM 11

For the remaining placemats we are working with 44" WOF.

Placemat #2

- Take 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strip from fabric **B** and 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strip from fabric **E** and sew them right sides together.




DIAGRAM 12

- Using a rotary cutter and a clear ruler cut 16 (sixteen) $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$ **B-E** vertical strip. We will call these strip sets 1.




DIAGRAM 13

- Flip your strip pieces horizontally and sew the following sets:
- Sew 2 (two) **B-E** strip set 1 together. We will call them SS2.
- Make 5 (five) SS2.




DIAGRAM 14

- Take 1 (one) SS2 and 1 (one) $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **B** and sew them right sides together. We will call this Section 1.
- Make 4 (four) Section 1.




DIAGRAM 15

- Measure 3" from the left edge of 1 (one) Section 1 and make a mark. Then match the left short end of 1 (one) Section 1 with the mark made on the other Section 1 and sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 2




DIAGRAM 16

- Measure $\frac{3}{4}$ " on the bottom left of Section 2 and make a mark, then take 1 (one) Section 1 and edge match it to the mark made on Section 2. Sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 3.




DIAGRAM 17

- Measure $\frac{3}{4}$ " on the top left edge of 1 (one) Section 1 and make a mark. Then edge match with Section 3. Sew them right sides together.
- We will call this Section 4.




DIAGRAM 18

- Measure 3" on the bottom left of Section 4 and make a mark, then take 1 (one) SS1 and edge match to the mark made on Section 4. Sew them right sides together.







- DIAGRAM 22

BINDING

Sew rights sides together.

- Cut enough strips 2½" wide by the width of the fabric **I** to make a final strip 266" long. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the quilt, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ¼" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge.
- Stop stitching ¼" before the edge of the quilt (**DIAGRAM B 1**). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of 45° and upward, pressing with your fingers (**DIAGRAM B2**). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (**DIAGRAM B3**). Start sewing at ¼" of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four corners of the quilt.
- Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pencil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the quilt, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.
