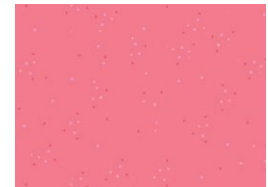

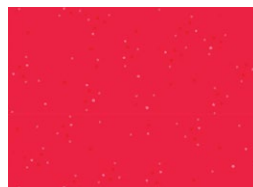

Fabric K	PE405	$\frac{1}{8}$ yd.

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

$\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.

Fabric A

- One (1) 21" x 1½" strip.

Fabric B

Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric C

- Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric D

- Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric E

- One (1) 21" x 1½" strip.
- Two (2) 16½" squares.

Fabric F

- Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric G

- Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric H

- One (1) 21" x 1½" strip.

Fabric I

- One (1) 21" x 1½" strip.
- Eight (8) 6½" squares.
- One (1) 20" x 5½" strip.
- One (1) 25" x 3½" strip.
- One (1) 16½" square.

Fabric J

- Two (2) 21" x 1½" strips.

Fabric K

- One (1) 4" x WOF strip.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

For this project we will work with four different strip sets.

Strip Set 1 (SS1).

- Sew one (1) 21" x 1½" strip from fabrics **F**, **D**, **J**, and **E**.
- Sew the first strip 1½" in from the left edge of the second strip. Then, sew the second strip 1½" in from the left edge of the third strip. Finally, sew the fourth strip 1½" in from the left edge of the third strip.
- Using the 45 degree guide from your quilting ruler cut eight (8) 1½" wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 1.

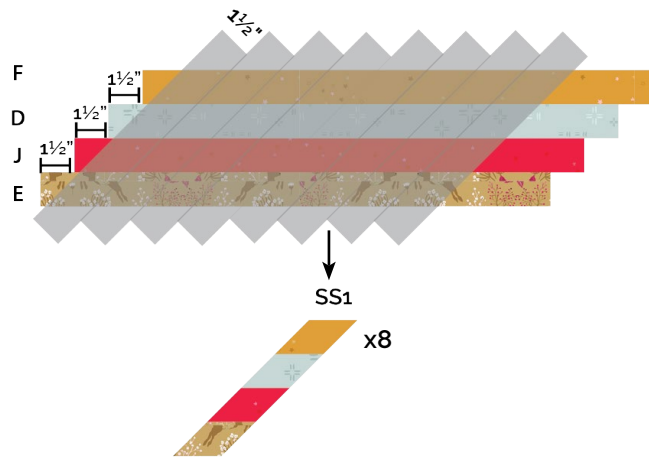


DIAGRAM 1

Strip Set 2 (SS2).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1, sew one (1) 21" x 1 1/2" strip from fabric **C**, **G**, **I**, and **J**.
- Cut eight (8) 1 1/2" wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 2.

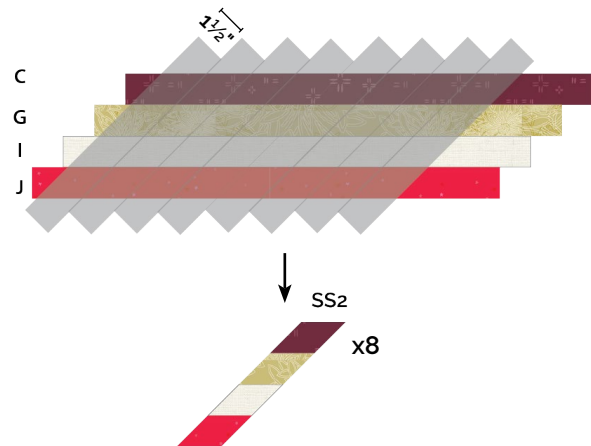


DIAGRAM 2

Strip Set 3 (SS3).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1, sew one (1) 21" x 1 1/2" strip from fabric **B**, **H**, **G**, and **D**.
- Cut eight (8) 1 1/2" wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 3.

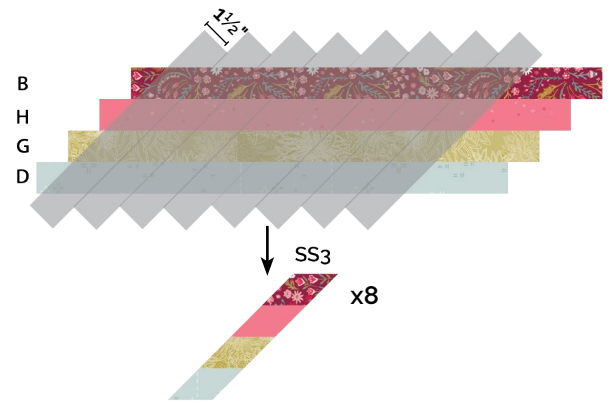


DIAGRAM 3

Strip Set 4 (SS4).

- Following the same steps as in strip set 1, sew one (1) 21" x 1 1/2" strip from fabric **A**, **B**, **C**, and **F**.
- Cut eight (8) 1 1/2" wide diagonal strips.
- For fabric placement and attachment follow diagram 4.

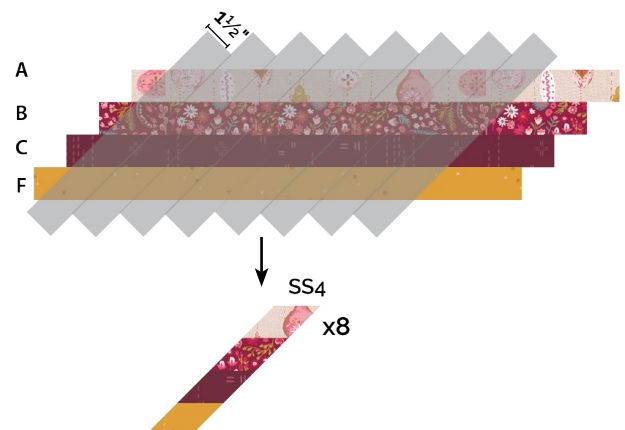


DIAGRAM 4

- Take a 6½" square from fabric I and cut it diagonally. You will end up with two triangles per square.
- Repeat the same step with the remaining 6½" squares. You should have sixteen (16) triangles in total.

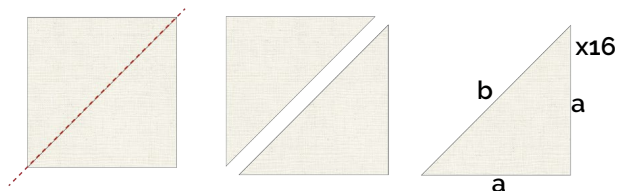


DIAGRAM 5

Block 1:

- Sew SS1, SS2, SS3 and SS4.
- Repeat this step 7 more times.
- You should have a total of eight blocks 1.

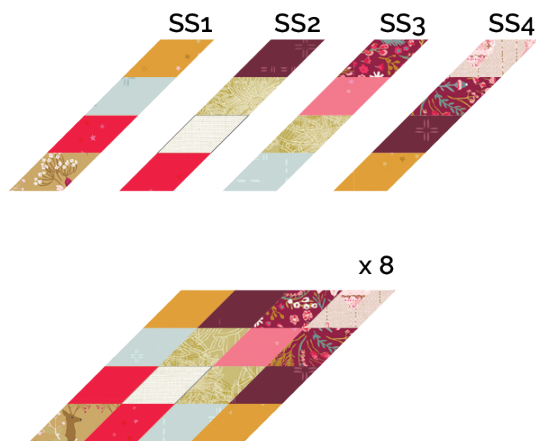


DIAGRAM 6

Block 2:

- Sew two triangles from fabric I to block 1.
- Note the orientation of block 1 before sewing the triangles.
- Repeat this step 7 more times, you should have a total of eight block 2.
- See diagram below for reference.

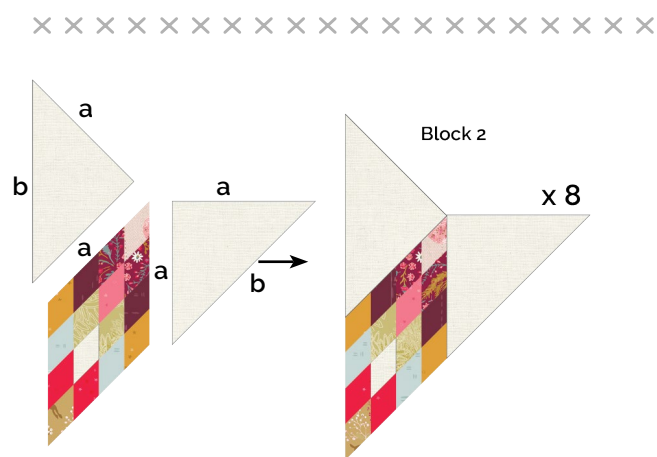


DIAGRAM 7

Block 3:

- Sew two blocks 2 together. Repeat this step three more times.
- You should have a total of four blocks 3.

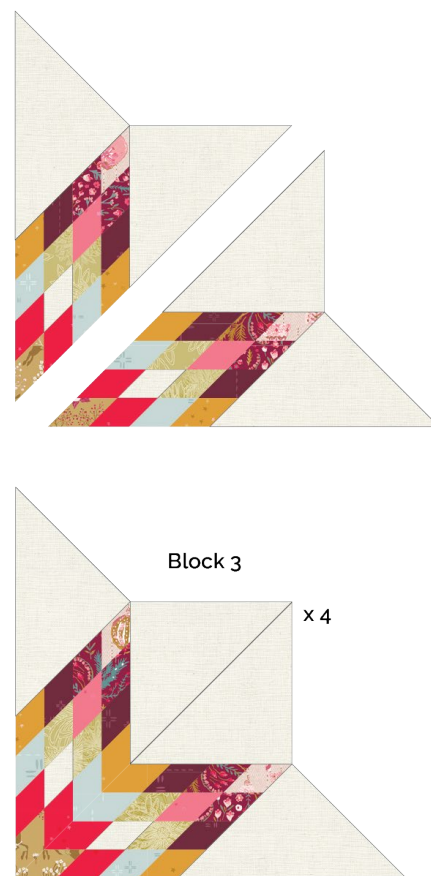


DIAGRAM 8

- Arrange blocks 3 into two rows of two blocks each and sew them.
- Then, sew both rows together.

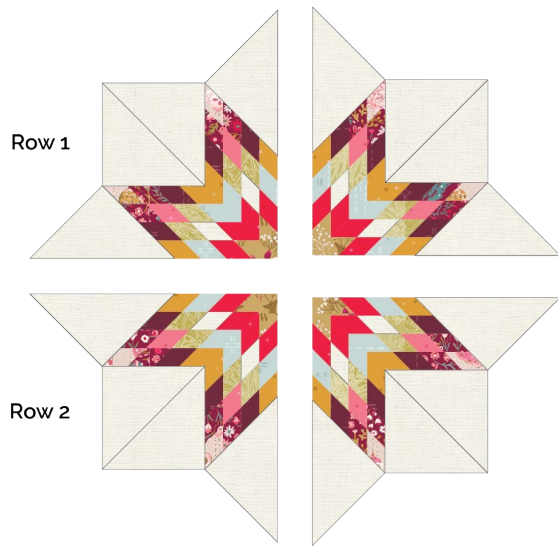


DIAGRAM 9

- Trim excess fabric. See diagram below for reference.



DIAGRAM 10

- Sew one (1) 20" x 5½" strip from fabric I to the left side of the sewn unit.

DIAGRAM 11

- Sew one (1) 25" x 3½" strip from fabric I to the top of the sewn unit.
- Trim excess fabric.

25" x 3½"



DIAGRAM 12

- Create a 16½" square cardboard template, place it on top of the sewn unit.
- In order to get the offset effect tilt the template slightly towards the left, and cut the fabric following the outlines of the 16½" square template.

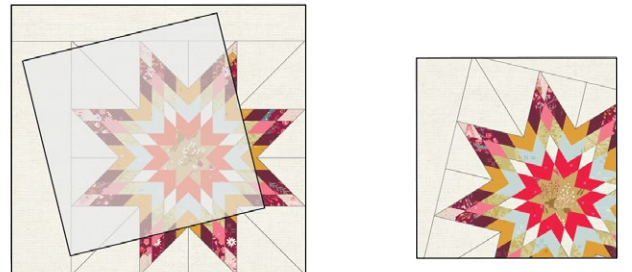


DIAGRAM 13

- Take one (1) square from fabri **I** and sew it with lone star block by the sides and bottom. Repeat the same step with two (2) 16½" square from fabric **E** (That will be the lining)
- See diagram below.

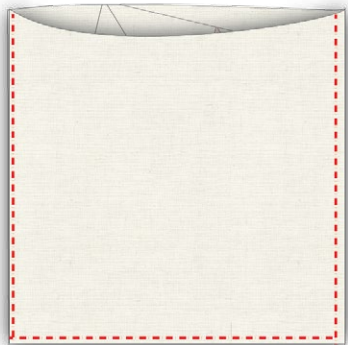


DIAGRAM 14

- Insert the main bag inside the lining body, so the right sides are together.
- Match all the seamlines and pin.
- See diagram below for reference.



DIAGRAM 15

- Beginning at a side seam, stitch a ¼" seam almost all the way around the tote, stopping 4" before the starting point. That will give you ample room for turning.
- Pull both fabrics through the 4" gap, turning the tote bag right-side out.
- Top-stitch around the tote bag's entire opening to finish edges.

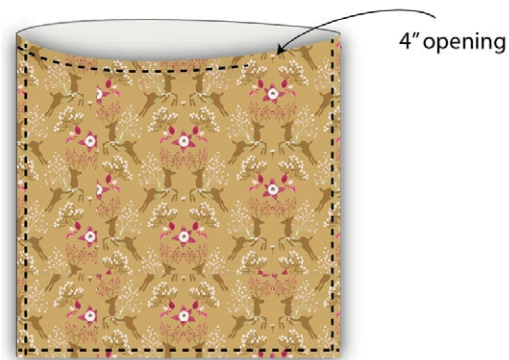


DIAGRAM 16

Straps,

- Use 4" x WOF strips from fabric **K**.
- Gate fold the strip and then fold in half.
- Trim around 21" for each strap.
- Press and edge stitch both sides.

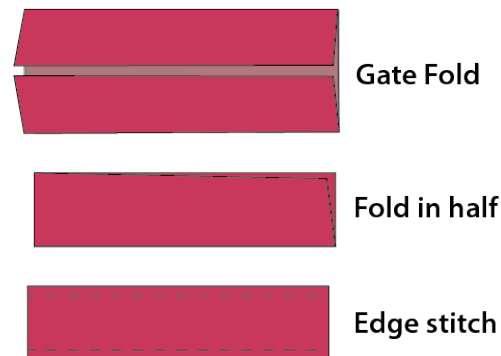


DIAGRAM 17

- Stitch handles ½" facing the right side of the bag.
- Secure the straps by stitching a rectangle on each strap.
