

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Please read all instructions thoroughly before beginning.

A fat quarter width of fabric (WOF) is typically 22"-wide.

Cutting instructions are based on 22"-and 42"-wide fabrics.

LINING FABRIC

DSE-708 ¾ yds (Included)

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

*¼" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.*

- Cut 5 (five) 1½" x WOF strips from fabrics **A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I** and **J**. (These cutting pieces are based on a 22" WOF)

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

Strip Set 1:

- Join 1 (one) 1½" x WOF strip from fabrics **A-B-C-D-E**. You should end up with a 5½"x 22" strip block. Make a total 3 strip blocks of the same fabric combination.
- Now, cut 1½" vertical strips, you should be able to cut 14 (fourteen) vertical strips per strip block.
- For this project, we need a total of 34 (thirty four) **SS1**.




DIAGRAM 1

Strip Set 2:

- Join 1 (one) 1½" x WOF strip from fabrics **F-G-H-I-J**. You should end up with a 5½"x 22" strip block. Make a total 3 strip blocks of the same fabric combination.
- Now, cut 1½" vertical strips, you should be able to cut 14 (fourteen) vertical strips per strip block.
- For this project, we need a total of 34 (thirty four) **SS2**.




DIAGRAM 2

Strip Set 3

- Join 1 (one) 1½" x WOF strip from fabrics **A-B-C-D-E-F-G-H-I-J**. You should end up with a 10½"x 22" strip block.
- Now, cut 9 (nine) 1½" vertical strips.




DIAGRAM 3

Block 1

- Join 13 (thirteen) SS1 and SS2 in the order shown on diagram below.
- When the number 1 and 2 are in red, means the strip set is placed upside down.




DIAGRAM 4

- Place the body of the hat template on top of block 1 and cut it. Make sure to mark
- the notches indicated in the pattern.




DIAGRAM 5

Block 2

- Join twenty one (21) SS1 and SS2 in the order shown on diagram below.
- When the number 1 and 2 are in red, means the strip set is placed upside down.




DIAGRAM 6

- Take the dresden template and cut 12 (twelve) pieces from block 2.
- Alternate the position of the template as you are cutting. See the diagram below for reference.




DIAGRAM 7

- Join the twelve (12) dresden pieces along the sides with the narrow edges pointing the same direction, as shown below, this will form the brim of the hat.
